◆ A Knox County man was arrested at a Knoxville church in the early hours of Christmas morning after a small fire was reportedly set in a bridal suite. 34-year-old Billy Walker of Seymour, entered Church Street United Methodist in Knoxville through a set of unlocked front doors around 3 a.m. He then went downstairs and locked himself in a bridal suite where investigators say he set a bench and paper towel dispenser on fire. A custodian who was in the building at the time heard the fire alarm and found Walker locked inside the bridal suite. The custodian noticed smoke inside the room and the smell of something burning after the door to the bridal suite was eventually opened. Walker faces one count of aggravated arson.

◆ Peg McKamey Bean, founding member of the award-winning, East Tennessee-based southern gospel music group 'The McKameys', has died. She and her two sisters, Carol and Dora, first founded the group in 1954. The Clinton-based group eventually expanded to include several more family members over several decades of performing across North America. The group earned multiple Singing News Fan Awards and had several songs reach No. 1 on Singing News magazine's charts. McKamey-Bean was inducted into The Southern Gospel Music Hall Of Fame in 2016. The group retired from full-time touring in 2019. McKamey Legacy, a trio consisting of group members Connie Fortner, who is McKamey-Bean's daughter, her husband Roger Fortner, and their son Elijah, began performing in 2021.

C tocks were modestly higher. The S&P 500 contined the rally that began nearly eight weeks ago. Stocks are now in the middle of the "Santa Claus Rally" period. Treasury yields also moved lower. The 10-year Treasury yield fell to around 3.84%. The Dow Jones was up 111.19 to 37,656.52. The S&P 500 was up 6.83 to 4,781.58, and the NASDAQ was up 24.60 to 15,099.18.
