MVA Congress Pkwy & Dennis St

On April 22, 2024, at approximately 6:54 am officers of the Athens Police Department responded to an MVA with injuries at the intersection of Congress Parkway at Dennis Street. Upon officers' arrival they observed there had been a two-vehicle collision between a Ford Taurus and a Dodge Pickup truck. Athens Fire Department and EMS worked to extricate the victims from the vehicle. Three of the four occupants of the Taurus were transported by AMR to Starr Athens Hospital for injuries and the fourth occupant of the Taurus was transported via Lifestar to Erlanger Children's Hospital with life-threatening injuries. The driver of the pickup was transported via private vehicle for medical treatment. This remains an active investigation. AUB Water Line and Hydrant Flushing

Athens Utilities Board (AUB) will conduct water line and fire hydrant flushing throughout the city from Monday, April 22, to Friday, April 26. This process, typically done at night, will now occur during the day, starting at 8 a.m. and ending at 5 p.m., weather permitting. AUB spokesperson Amy McDonald highlighted the benefits of this shift, including reduced disruption for customers, enhanced crew safety, and cost savings.

"We've tried several different start times, and it looks like doing this during the day has great benefits in less disruption for our customers, better safety for our crews, and it saves money by not having to pay so much overtime," McDonald said. "By using only water personnel, disruptions to other divisions will also be minimized."

Flushing, an essential preventive maintenance measure, ensures year-round access to clean, sediment-free water. AUB crews will systematically flush different sections of the system each weekday, expelling sediment and stale water from main lines. Residents may experience intermittent low water pressure and slightly cloudy water during and after the flushing process. AUB advises against washing clothes during these times to avoid potential discoloration due to sediment. To minimize environmental impact, sodium thiosulfate is used to neutralize chlorine in the discharged water.

Etowah Commissioner James and Son Accused of Illegal Hunting



In a story initially covered by Sam Talley of NewsChannel9, an Etowah city commissioner is confronting three misdemeanor charges after being accused of engaging in an illicit turkey hunt alongside his underage son, as outlined by authorities from the Tennessee Wildlife Resources Agency (TWRA). According to an affidavit dated April 2024, John James and his 13-year-old son were allegedly involved in the unauthorized harvesting of a male wild turkey around April

8th, 2023. TWRA investigators obtained a warrant to search James' cellphone on January 19th, 2024, and subsequently extracted data from the device on January 19th and 20th. Information retrieved from James' phone, including images, messages, and location data, suggests that the hunt took place near Calhoun, Tennessee, on property owned by Wright Brothers Construction Company, where they lacked permission to hunt. As a result, James is facing charges of hunting without permission, illegal possession of big game, and contributing to the delinquency of a minor. This is not the first instance where James has been accused

of unlawful hunting practices, as he previously faced charges from TWRA officials in January of the same year for similar offenses, including hunting without permission and violating hunting regulations.
