TBI agents arrest, charge Meigs County man in Georgetown arson investigation




Tennessee Bureau of Investigation special agents specializing in fire investigations, working alongside the Meigs County Sheriff's Office, have arrested and charged a Georgetown man in connection with an arson investigation.


On June 15, 2023, agents began investigating a suspicious fire that destroyed a detached garage at a home in the 3000 block of Sugar Creek Road in Georgetown. During the course of the investigation, authorities determined that the property owner, James Harry Burch, was the individual responsible for starting the fire.

Burch was arrested on March 19th and charged with one count of Arson, one count of Burning Personal Property, one count of Filing a False Report, one count of Tampering with Evidence, one count of Insurance Fraud \$10,000-\$60,000, and one count of Insurance Fraud \$60,000-\$250,000. He was booked into the Meigs County Jail on \$25,000 bond.

The charges and allegations referenced in this release are merely accusations of criminal conduct and not evidence. The defendant is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt and convicted through due process of law. Tennessee's Unemployment Rate Holds Steady at 3.7% for Six Months

Tennessee's unemployment rate remains unchanged at 3.7% for the sixth consecutive month, staying below the national average, according to the **Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development (TDLWD).**

The state's seasonally adjusted unemployment rate for February 2025 remained at 3.7%, consistent since September 2024. However, it is slightly higher than the 3.1% rate recorded in February 2024. Meanwhile, the national unemployment rate rose to 4.1%, increasing by 0.1 percentage points from January and 0.2 percentage points from a year ago.

Tennessee saw 19,200 new nonfarm jobs added over the past year, with the most growth in Government, Leisure and Hospitality, and Education and Health Services. Between January and February alone, the state added 9,100 jobs, led by Education and Health Services, Trade, Transportation and Utilities, and Leisure and Hospitality sectors.

Fire in Etowah Spreads Across Three Acres





A fire broke out on County Road 490 in Etowah around 6 p.m. on Tuesday after a property owner's attempt to burn household items got out of control. The flames quickly spread up a bank, reaching a large pile of tires and burning approximately three acres, including some neighboring property. Multiple fire departments responded to the scene, including Etowah Rural Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, and mutual aid from Monroe County's Conasauga Fire and Mt. Vernon Fire Departments. The incident was led by Etowah Rural Deputy Fire Chief Dustin Ruebush and Englewood Rural Fire Chief Billy Roach.

Authorities remind residents to use extreme caution when burning materials outdoors, especially in dry conditions.
