JapanFest Turns Athens into Little Tokyo - and More Events Are on the Way



A swirl of drumming, paper cranes, and friendly robot showdowns filled the Athens City Intermediate School gymnasium on Tuesday evening as more than 200 residents stepped into a lively slice of Japanese culture.

JapanFest 2025 transformed the gym into a whirlwind of sumo demonstrations, shamisen music, taiko drumming, origami folding, rice-ball making, kimono fittings, calligraphy practice, chopstick challenges, and even a tic-tac-toe duel against a DENSO robot arm. The event is part of a year-long lecture and workshop series presented by the Athens-Isahaya Sister City Committee, which aims to bring the traditions and everyday joys of Japan to the local community.

Tellico Plains High School receiving \$500K for new track and field facility



State Rep. Mark Cochran of Englewood, secured \$500,000 in state funding for Tellico Plains High School (TPHS) in Monroe County.

The funding will be used to build a track and field facility at the school.

“Tellico Plains High School has a proud legacy of excellence in track and field, yet it has never had a track to call its own,” Cochran said. “Not once has a home meet been held at TPHS. I am confident this appropriation will finally turn that long-held dream into a reality.”

Cochran hopes the appropriation will honor the memory of Darrah Wiseman, a standout runner who was killed in a car crash on Nov. 2, 2024. Wiseman won six state championships in track and cross country. She had qualified for the state meet the week before her death and planned to run at Tennessee Tech University.

The project will provide student-athletes a dedicated space to train and compete, while honoring Wiseman’s legacy and impact on the school community.

The appropriated funds are part of a \$59.8 billion balanced budget that was passed by the General Assembly and guided by Assistant Majority Leader Cochran in April.

Rep. Mark Cochran represents District 23 which includes McMinn and part of Monroe counties.
