### Monroe County Receives State Funding for Road Safety Project in Tellico Plains



State Representative Mark Cochran of Englewood and State Senator Tom Hatcher of Maryville have secured \$131,350 in state funding for Monroe County to improve road safety near the Tellico Convenience Center in Tellico Plains, officials announced this week.

The funds will be used to construct a dedicated turn lane into the center, which serves as a site for local residents to dispose of household waste and recyclables.

"This funding will address a serious need and ensure Monroe County residents can easily utilize the Tellico Convenience Center," said the officials who advocated for the project. "Safe and efficient infrastructure is essential for the success of local communities. We thank our colleagues for recognizing the importance of this much-needed up-

grade and look forward to the completion of this turn lane."

The Tellico Convenience Center is one of five recycling facilities operated by Monroe County, offering no-cost disposal of certain materials to residents. For more information, visit the **Monroe County Department of Solid Waste** website. This funding is part of the \$59.8 billion balanced budget approved by the state legislature in April.

### MTSU Professor Indicted Following Joint State Investigation



A professor at Middle Tennessee State University has been arrested following a joint investigation by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation and the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury.

The investigation began on May 9, 2024, at the request of 16th Judicial District Attorney General Jennings Jones. Authorities looked into allegations of financial crimes involv-

ing MTSU students. Investigators reviewed the personal financial records of Don Hong, 65, and concluded that he used his position to misappropriate state funds between 2020 and 2024.

On Monday, a Rutherford County grand jury indicted Hong on multiple charges, including two counts of Theft, one count each of Forgery, Criminal Simulation, Official Misconduct, Official Oppression, and Retaliation. He was booked into the Rutherford County Jail on Wednesday with bond set at \$500,000.

It is important to note that the charges are allegations. Hong is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty in a court of law. **Source: TBI Newsroom.com**

# 30th Annual Athens Soap Box Derby set for Saturday, May 31



The 30th Annual Athens Soap Box Derby will be held on Saturday, May 31, on Keith Lane in Athens. The Athens Soap Box Derby is a preliminary to the 87th running of the All-American Soap Box Derby World Championships, which will be held in Akron, Ohio, the week of July 13-19. Athens will be running two divisions: the Stock Division, and the Super Stock Division.

The Stock division is the beginning class designed for racers 7-13 years old and is a lean forward car. The driver and car together, in the Stock Division, race at 200 pounds.

The Super Stock Division is for racers ages 9-18 years old and can accommodate a larger racer up to approximately six feet tall and 160 pounds. The driver and car together, in the Super Stock Division, race at 240

pounds. Drivers are still being sought for both divisions with some cars available for use first-come, first-serve.

On Saturday, May 31, beginning at 4 a.m., Keith Lane from Cedar Springs to Powers Path will be closed to automobile traffic and turned into a Soap Box Derby track. Residents will be allowed to enter at the eastern side intersection of Crestway and Keith. All other access will be restricted to Soap Box Derby traffic.

A Soap Box Derby car rides approximately 3.5 inches off the ground and will attain speeds of approximately 21 miles per hour on Keith Lane. The cars are entirely gravity powered and have a brake and steering wheel. The track is approximately 950 feet of racing with a long runout area. The races are electronically timed and are double elimination, lane swap, wheel swap, time differential races. This means that each "race" consists of two runs down the hill with a common opponent. In the first phase of the heat, the cars race on their own wheels in a starting lane. When the cars cross the finish line, the timer records the difference of the two racers. The racers are taken back to the top where they will switch wheels and lanes and make a second run. The lowest total time down the hill, in two runs under the same conditions, is declared the winner of the race. The Soap Box Derby practice begins at 7:15 a.m., with opening ceremonies scheduled for 8:00 a.m. and the first heats immediately following.

Live race coverage can be heard on WYXI Radio AM 1390 and FM 94.5. Admission to the Athens Soap Box Derby is free.

# Athens Couple Says Contractor Took Payment, Left Job Unfinished



An Athens couple is speaking out after claiming a contractor they hired took more than \$9,000 upfront and failed to complete the work he was paid to do.

Johnny and Amy Guillot, who run a dog training and boarding business from their home, hired contractor Jerry Gardner of Decatur in February to complete several home improvement projects. The job included installing new flooring, ceiling work in the basement, adding lighting fixtures, and structural leveling. The work was expected to take less than a week.

While Gardner started part of the flooring, the Guillots say he never worked a full day, frequently gave excuses, and eventually stopped showing up altogether. The hallway floor that was installed is already coming apart, and the rest of the contracted work remains undone.

The Guillots sent a demand letter on April 14 requesting Gardner respond within 10 days—he did not. They have since filed a formal complaint with the Tennessee Department of Commerce and Insurance and issued a second demand letter.

Experts warn homeowners against paying contractors in full upfront. Standard practice recommends an initial deposit of 10–25%, with additional payments made as work progresses, and the final balance paid only upon completion.

The Guillots hope sharing their story will prevent others from facing the same costly mistake.
