#### Athens to host Juneteenth Celebration at Cook Park

## Athens City Council to Review Budget, Fire Station Plans and More at Upcoming Work Session



The Athens City Council will hold a work session later TODAY, Monday, May 12, at 5:00 p.m. in the Burkett L. Witt Council Chambers at the Athens Municipal Building to discuss several key issues ahead of its May 20 regular meeting.

Among the most significant items on the agenda is the presentation of the proposed FY 2025–26 Athens City Schools budget, which outlines a \$32.2 million financial plan. The Council will also review the city's overall budget proposal and a budget amendment for the current fiscal year.

The Council is also expected to discuss the **selection of Wold Architects & Engineers** to design the new Fire Station #3. The firm was recommended after a competitive evaluation process and would lead both planning and design phases, with construction anticipated to be funded over two fiscal years.

In addition, Council members will consider a **renewal of the city's health insurance plan**, which could shift to the state's Blue Cross/Blue Shield offering to control rising costs. Also on the agenda are discussions about the **demolition of the former North City School**, the **renewal of a contract with TDOT** for maintenance of state routes, and **authorization to apply for a federal Safe Streets grant** to improve traffic safety at key intersections, including Decatur Pike and Congress Parkway.

A public hearing and second reading of Ordinance 1139 is also scheduled, which proposes increasing the number of local liquor store licenses from two to three.

The Council will also review several board appointments, including positions on the Athens Utilities Board, Board of Adjustment & Appeals, and the Recreation Advisory Board.

#### 4.1 Magnitude Earthquake Shakes Tennessee-North Carolina Border Region



A 4.1 magnitude earthquake struck near the Tennessee-North Carolina border Saturday morning, rattling residents across several counties and prompting temporary closures along Foothills Parkway.


According to the U.S. Geological Survey (USGS), the quake occurred at 9:04 a.m. EDT and was centered about 12.9 miles southeast of Greenback and 14.4 miles south of Maryville, at a depth of 25 kilometers (approximately 16 miles) beneath the surface. The earthquake was initially measured at a 3.5 magnitude, but was later upgraded to 4.1 following further analysis.

Residents in McMinn County, across East Tennessee, and as far away as **Atlanta**, **Georgia** reported feeling the tremor, though no major damage or injuries have been confirmed. As a precaution, parts of the **Foothills Parkway** were temporarily closed for inspection following the quake.

Saturday's earthquake is one of the strongest in the region in recent years. The **strongest recorded earthquake** in the area occurred near Alcoa in 1973, registering a **magnitude of 4.7**. More recently, a 3.8 magnitude quake was recorded in Campbell County's Fincastle area in 2020.

The U.S. Geological Survey and the University of Memphis continue to monitor seismic activity in the Southeast through the Southeast US Seismic Network. For updated maps and technical data, residents can visit the USGS Earthquake Hazards Program website.

#### Lady Vols Rowing Finishes Second in Historic SEC Championship Debut



In the first-ever SEC Rowing Championship, the No. 4-ranked Tennessee Lady Vols delivered a powerful performance Sunday on Melton Hill Lake, winning three races and pushing No. 2 Texas to the limit before ultimately finishing second overall.

"It was really exciting to watch our team and cheer for them," said head coach Kim Cupini. "We just told the women that we wanted to have them in there and fight against Texas. We knew they were going to be fast."

The championship came down to a high-stakes showdown in the 1V8+ race, with Tennessee

and Texas—two of the nation's top four programs—vying for the title. The Lady Vols took an early lead, but crossed the finish line in 6:15.586, just over three seconds behind Texas, who claimed the gold with a time of 6:12.420.

Tennessee captured three event wins in the historic conference meet, including a standout performance in the 2V8+ event. The Lady Vols clocked 6:24.809 to edge out Texas (6:26.430), earning the SEC's first-ever gold medal in that race.

UT's dominance extended to the third varsity events, where the Lady Vol 3V8+ boat finished more than seven seconds ahead of Texas, and the 3V4+ squad earned a narrow victory by just 0.215 seconds—the slimmest margin of the day.

"The venue rocked," Cupini said. "Tennessee always rocks it at home, and to have such fans is awesome. Seeing fans of other schools, as well, was really cool."

Texas claimed victories in both varsity four events. Tennessee finished 11 seconds back in the 1V4+ and stayed close in the 2V4+, falling by just three seconds.

Next up, the Lady Vols will learn their NCAA Championship seeding during the selection show on **Tuesday**, **May 20**, at 5 p.m. ET. The national championship will take place **May 30–June 1** in **Mercer**, **New Jersey**.

### Former Madisonville police officer indicted on three charges related to misuse of city fuel funds



A former Madisonville police officer has been indicted after a state investigation revealed he misused city-issued fuel purchasing cards, costing taxpayers more than \$3,000, according to a report released by the Tennessee Comptroller of the Treasury.

The investigation focused on fuel purchases made by Bobby Mack Woods, who served with the Madisonville Police Department from May 2021 until his resignation in December 2023. The probe covered records from February 1, 2022, through December 31, 2023.

Investigators determined that Woods misappropriated at least \$3,072.71 by using his department-issued fuel card on 84 occasions for personal use—including while off duty, outside city limits without a documented reason, and for fuel quantities exceeding his patrol vehicle's capacity. Woods admitted to using the card for personal purposes.


The report also flagged an additional \$2,270.43 in questionable fuel charges based on odometer readings that did not align with the fuel amounts purchased.

On May 7, 2025, a Monroe County Grand Jury indicted Woods on three charges: Theft of Property (\$2,500 to \$10,000), Fraudulent Use of a Debit or Credit Card (\$2,500 to \$10,000), and Official Misconduct. He is presumed innocent until proven guilty in court.

The investigation further uncovered serious internal control issues within the city. Until June 2024, the City of Madisonville lacked formal written policies governing the use of fuel purchasing cards and failed to implement adequate oversight. Officials also did not report the suspected fraud to the Comptroller's Office as required by Tennessee law.

According to the report, city officials have indicated they have corrected or plan to correct the identified deficiencies.
