Fleischmann Leads Bipartisan Effort to Invite Pope Leo XIV to Address Congress



Congressman Chuck Fleischmann (TN-03) has sent a formal letter to House Speaker Mike Johnson and House Minority Leader Hakeem Jeffries requesting a Joint Session of Congress be convened for an address by Pope Leo XIV, the first American-born pontiff in history.

"The election of Pope Leo XIV to the papacy is a historic and momentous occasion not just for Catholics across the United States but for all Americans regardless of faith or denomination," said Fleischmann in a statement. "An address to Congress and the American People by Pope Leo XIV would serve as a powerful reminder to our shared commitments to peace, service to others, and moral leadership and also reaffirm the deep and longstanding ties between the United States of America and The Holy See."

In the letter, Fleischmann wrote, "Pope Leo XIV's life and ministry, shaped in part by his experiences in our own nation, equip him with a voice that speaks not only to Catholics, but to people of all faiths and backgrounds."

He added that, "During a time when our nation needs unifying and the world faces severe humanitarian crises, an address by His Holiness would serve as a powerful reminder of our shared commitments to peace, service to others, and moral leadership."

Fleischmann's letter was supported by a group of bipartisan colleagues and underscores the significance of Pope Leo XIV's election as a symbol of unity and shared values. If the invitation is ex-

tended and accepted, it would mark a rare and historic occasion, echoing past papal addresses such as that of Pope Francis in 2015.





While the class is currently full, those interested may join the wait-








