

'Armed and Dangerous' fugitive captured in Monroe County

A man considered armed and dangerous by authorities has been captured, ten days after the Monroe County Sheriff's Office issued a public alert seeking information on his whereabouts. Morning Fax Today's News. This Morning.

Monroe County Sheriff Tommy Jones announced Saturday that **Dakota Narciso Rowe** was taken into custody in the early morning hours by deputies with the department's Delta Shift. Rowe was located at a residence in Tellico Plains.

"Mr. Rowe went from a living room couch to a jail cell," Jones said in a statement released over the weekend.

Rowe was wanted on a string of serious charges, including three counts of aggravated assault with a deadly weapon, one of which involved a victim under the age of one. Additional charges include theft of property, aggravated burglary, reckless endangerment, interference with a 911 call, and employment of a firearm during the commission of a felony.

The search for Rowe gained public attention on May 7, when Sheriff Jones featured him in a "Wanted Wednesday" post on social media, asking residents for tips and warning that Rowe was likely armed and dangerous. Authorities also noted he may have been traveling on a black and



red motorcycle at the time.

No injuries were reported during the arrest. Rowe is now being held at the Monroe County Jail. *Source: <u>WATE</u>*

Tennessee's unemployment rate declined for the second consecutive month in April, according to new figures from the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development. The state's seasonally adjusted rate dropped to

3.5%, down from 3.6% in March. Although slightly higher than last year's 3.2%, it remains well below the national average of **4.2%**.

State officials report that employers have added 24,000 jobs over the past year, with the most growth in government, leisure and hospitality, and trade, transportation, and utilities. Between March and April alone, Tennessee saw an increase of 8,600 nonfarm jobs. Morning Fax
