SUV Collides with Semi at Niota Truck Stop



A serious crash occurred around 8:15 a.m. Wednesday on Highway 309 at the Pilot truck stop in Niota, involving a Chevrolet Equinox and a semi-truck.

According to reports, the SUV was traveling eastbound when it struck the rear wheels of a semi-trailer exiting the truck stop, ripping the wheels from the trailer. The female driver of the Equinox was extricated by fire crews and transported by ambulance to the

Woods Memorial Foundation Board Seeks Funding Applicants


The Woods Memorial Hospital Foundation Board is seeking requests for funding from local organizations and agencies for projects designed to better the health and wellbeing of the community.

City and county officials say the facility represents a long-awaited investment in local animal welfare and will serve as a valuable resource for years to come.



Young Racers Set to Fly Down Keith Lane at Athens Soap Box Derby



The excitement is building as the Athens Soap Box Derby returns this Saturday, May 31, beginning at 10:00 a.m. on Keith Lane in Athens. Racers should arrive by 7:30 am and Practice Runs will begin at 8. Official races will begin between 9:30 and 10 am. Local youth will compete in gravity-powered cars in one of Athens' most anticipated community events of the year.

The event, part of the FirstEnergy All-American Soap Box Derby program, will feature two racing divisions: Stock and Super Stock. Dozens of young drivers will be sponsored by area businesses and organizations, all competing for a chance to advance to the national championships in Akron, Ohio, in July.

Dr. Robin L. Pierce, Jr., 90 of Athens, passed away peacefully after a life devoted to education, faith, community, and family. Robin earned his B.S. from Bethel College, his M.A. from George Peabody College, and his Ed.D. from Memphis State University. Robin began his career as a biology teacher and basketball coach at Dyersburg High School in Tennessee. In 1973, he was named Superintendent of Athens City Schools—a role he held with distinction for 27 years. He was named Tennessee School Superintendent of the Year in 1988 and served five years as president of the Tennessee Organization of School Superintendents. A funeral service will be conducted 2:30 pm, Sunday, June 1 at East Athens Baptist Church. Interment will be at New Haven Cemetery in Ridgely, TN. The family will receive friends at the church in the fellowship hall from 2:30-3:30, Sunday following the service. Community Supports McMinn EMS Worker Following Major Heart Attack



The community is rallying behind longtime EMS worker Eric Johnson, who is recovering after suffering a major heart attack and multiple cardiac arrests last week. Johnson, who has served in emer-

gency services for over 37 years, was transported to Parkwest Medical Center in Knoxville, where doctors had to shock his heart nearly 60 times during emergency procedures.

The family has faced additional hardship, having lost Eric's wife just over a year ago. According to a fellow paramedic, Johnson had appeared to be in good health just hours before the incident

With Eric unable to work for the foreseeable future, a GoFundMe has been launched by friends to assist with medical and household expenses. So far, over \$4,000 has been raised. His son, Tyler Johnson, noted that financial support and prayers are both deeply appreciated as the family navigates this challenging time.

Johnson is now off the ventilator and showing slow signs of improvement. He remains on in-room dialysis and continues to receive care. The family is also using this experience to encourage others to take preventive steps for their heart health, reminding the community that cardiac events can strike unexpectedly. **Source: WBIR**
