Athens City Schools Launches Free Summer Meal Program Today

Athens City Schools is once again offering free summer meals to children and teens, with the 2025 Summer Feeding Program set to begin TODAY, Monday, June 2.. The program will run through July 18. Funded by the USDA and administered locally by Athens City Schools, the program provides nutritious meals to <u>all children 18 years and younger</u> at no cost. This initiative ensures that local youth have continued access to healthy food throughout the summer break.

There is one notable change this year: North City, previously one of the primary distribution sites, will no longer be available due to ongoing demolition at that location. As a result, several alternate sites have been added to the summer feeding schedule.

Distribution will be held Monday through Friday at Athens City Intermediate School, located at 255 Keith Lane. Families can utilize the drive-thru service between 11:00 a.m. and 1:00 p.m. In addition, mobile meal sites have been scheduled at the following community locations:

•Athens Gardens/Mews: 11:00–11:20 a.m. •Forrest Hills Apartments: 11:35–11:55 a.m.

•McMinn Villa: 12:20–12:45 p.m.

•Clem Jones Apartments: 1:00–1:20 p.m.

No sign-up or documentation is required, and meals are available on a first-come, first-served basis.

Organizations such as Vacation Bible Schools or summer camps that are interested in offering free meals through the program are encouraged to reach out to the program coordinator at 423-333-3347 for more information. The Summer Feeding Program is part of the USDA's commitment to supporting families and communities during the summer months by ensuring that children continue to receive the nutrition they need to thrive.

Athens City Schools reminds residents that the program is open to all children regardless of income and encourages families to take advantage of this important service.


