Englewood crash damages fire hydrant and power pole

A Sunday afternoon crash on South Amhurst Place at Englewood Avenue resulted in damage to a fire hydrant and power pole after the driver of a 2018 Ford Expedition lost control of the vehicle. Morning Fax

The incident occurred around 4:30 p.m. Emergency personnel from AMR transported both the driver and a passenger to Starr Regional Hospital in Etowah for evaluation.

Multiple agencies responded to the scene, including the Englewood Police Department, Englewood Rural Fire Department, Etowah City Fire Department, Athens Utilities Board (AUB), and the Tennessee Highway Patrol. THP Trooper Andrew Metelits is leading the investigation into the accident.

No further details about the cause of the crash or the condition of those involved were immediately available.

Widespread outage in Niota over weekend



More than 600 Athens Utilities Board customers lost power Saturday morning after a tree fell and Morning Fax broke a utility pole in Niota.

According to AUB, crews responded quickly and worked through the morning to restore power. With assistance from the Tennessee Department of Transportation (TDOT), the tree was cleared by 6:51 a.m., allowing crews to begin repairs. Furoshiki Night wraps up a colorful cultural experience in Athens



The Athens Isahaya Sister City Committee hosted a vibrant <u>Furoshiki</u> <u>Night</u> last Friday at the McMinn County Living Heritage Museum, offering participants a hands-on lesson in the traditional Japanese art of cloth wrapping.

Furoshiki, the practice of using decorative fabric to wrap gifts, lunch boxes, and more, blends beauty, function, and sustainability. Attendees learned not only how to tie intricate wraps, but also about the cultural significance of colors in Japan—red for celebration, navy or black for mourning, purple as a sign of respect, and green for everyday use.

In addition to being eco-friendly and endlessly reusable, Furoshiki cloths offer a compact alternative to bulky rolls of wrapping paper and gift bags. The event was part of the committee's year-long lecture series designed to strengthen cultural ties between Athens and its sister city, Isahaya, Japan.

The final

event in the series will be an Undokai, or Japanese sports day, held at the Athens YMCA on July 8. Sign-ups will be available soon via the <u>Athens Isahaya Sister City Committee Facebook page</u>.

Cleveland State Grad Builds Career Through Mechatronics and Hands-On Learning



Jonathan Leffew once thought he'd pursue engineering—until he discovered mechatronics, a field that combines mechanical, electrical, and computer systems used in advanced manufacturing and industry. Leffew enrolled at Cleveland State Community College, where he joined the Advanced Technologies Institute (ATI) and began interning with McKee Foods Corporation. The opportunity, he said, allowed him to earn while learning valuable hands-on skills.

After graduating from Cleveland State, Leffew transferred to the University of Tennessee at Chattanooga, earning his bachelor's degree in mechatronics this May. Throughout college, he continued his internship at McKee, working in various departments from mechanical systems to reliability engineering.

Jeff Carson, Maintenance Superintendent at McKee Foods, praised the ATI pro-


gram and Leffew's development, noting that the internship helps companies identify and train future employees.

2025 Athens Soap Box Derby Results

The 30th annual Athens Soap Box Derby was held on Saturday, May 31 with 23 racers in 2 divisions racing their way down Keith Lane toward Akron, Ohio and a spot in the 87 th Annual All-American Soap Box Derby World Championships on July 19th. The Soap Box Derby is a youth-oriented gravity car racing program which has been running in the United States since 1934.

In the Stock Car division, drivers aged 7 to 14 race in entry level cars where the car and driver race at 200 pounds.

The 2025 Athens Stock Car Champion is Silas Millsaps. At age 7, while small in stature, Millsaps proved to be a giant on the racetrack, in his first year of racing, winning undefeated in the double elimination format. Millsaps started his day with a bye and in the second round faced Madelyn Priestwood, who had defeated Danny Womac in the first round by .083 of a second. Millsaps defeated Priestwood by .298 sending her to the elimination bracket and him against Jace Kelso in round 3. Kelso defeated Mason Cook by .473 to advance to the matchup with Millsaps. Millsaps defeated Kelso by .078 to advance to the finals of the winner's bracket where he would race Elisha Hurst. Hurst had won three races to advance to the winners bracket final defeating Cage Jackson by .414, Haleigh Johnson by .404 and Charlie McLemore, in the closest race of the day at .001. McLemore had won his previous race against Chloe Mercer by .088 to advance. Mercer had a convincing round one win by .506 against Bladen Rogers before losing to McLemore. In the finals of the winner's bracket Millsaps narrowly defeated Hurst by .159 guaranteeing him no less than second and sending her to the elimination bracket.

Over in the elimination bracket racers found themselves in sudden death races and some of closest races of the entire day were run there. Mason Cook defeated Cage Jackson by .008, Bladen Rogers defeated Madelyn Priestwood by .339 and Chloe Mercer defeated Danny Womac by .698 ending their day of racing. In the second round of elimination Haleigh Johnson defeated Mercer by .032 and Priestwood defeated Cook by .111. In the third elimination round Kelso defeated Johnson by .140 and McLemore Priestwood by .109. The next round of elimination saw McLemore defeat Kelso by .339 giving him 4 th place and moving himself into an elimination race against Hurst, who had been waiting since losing in the Winner's bracket final against Millsaps. In another very close race, McLemore defeated Hurst by .040, giving her third place and him a shot at Millsaps for the title. In the championship race, Millsaps defeated McLemore by .303 preserving his undefeated run and claiming the trip to the World Championship.



2025 Athens Soap Box Derby Results

In the Super Stock division drivers and cars weigh a combined 240 pounds and the cars are larger to accommodate older, bigger drivers. In this division you often find past stock champions trying to pull off the career double winning both the Stock and Super Stock championships. There were 12 cars vying for the 30th anniversary Super Stock championship and the older racers ran incredibly close races. Arliss Douglas racing out of Tullahoma was the winner, going undefeated but barely.

In round one Douglas defeated Trinity Bevers by .555 advancing to round two where he raced and beat Matthew Davis by .487 to move to round three. Douglas then raced past Stock champ Zachery Newman who he beat by .433. This sent Douglas to the winners bracket final against Blair Hurst. Hurst arrived at the finals by defeating Cam Witt in

by a tight .057, Serenity Veals in round two by .268 and Raylen Hembree in round three by .260. In the winner's bracket final Douglas defeated Hurst by .419 dispatching Hurst to the elimination bracket.

Other action in round one saw 2024 Stock champion Titus Millsaps defeating Colin Grooms by .431, and Newman defeating Levi Brewster by .373. In the elimination bracket some of the best racing of the day occurred as drivers tried to keep their hopes for a championship alive. In

round two of the elimination bracket Cam Witt defeated Colin Grooms by .783 and Titus Millsaps defeated Levi Brewster by .700 to advance. In the next round of elimination Hembree defeated Witt by .576 and Millsaps defeated Newman by .490. Hembree then began a march to the championship run by defeating Millsaps by .402 and Hurst by .520, setting a crowd-pleasing championship with what appeared to be the best two cars, and they were not disappointed. Douglas and Hembree raced wheel to wheel to an exciting .021 championship run, won by Douglas.
