Tennessee Wesleyan University's baseball team made more than just headlines at the 2025 Avista NAIA World Series—they made SportsCenter.

Two standout defensive plays by Bulldog players were featured on ESPN's SportsCenter Top 10 in back-to-back games this week.

Center fielder Kruise Newman earned the No. 6 spot on the May 27 edition with a diving catch in the second inning against Webber International University. The tournament will feature


10 courts in play, including six permanent and four overlay courts, and will offer two age divisions and four skill brackets to accommodate a wide range of players.

Vols Punch Ticket to Super Regionals with 11-5 Win Over Wake Forest

No. 14 Tennessee is Super Regional bound for the fifth straight year after an 11–5 victory over Wake Forest in the NCAA Knoxville Regional final Monday night at Lindsey Nelson Stadium.

Fueled by a massive seven-run fourth inning, the Volunteers pulled away in the decisive Game 7 of the regional. Home runs from Manny Marin and Andrew Fischer blew the game wide open, igniting the sellout crowd and sealing Tennessee's spot in the NCAA Fayetteville Super Regional against No. 3 seed Arkansas.

Marin, a true freshman, had a breakout performance, going 3-for-3 with two runs scored and three RBIs. Fischer added his team-leading 24th home run of the season during the rally.



The Vols (46–17) used a combination of arms to get the job done Today's News. This Morning. on the mound. Starter AJ Russell struck out three in 1.2 innings before freshman Brayden Krenzel took over, earning the win after 2.2 scoreless frames. Dylan Loy, Tanner Franklin, and Liam Doyle closed out the game, with Doyle retiring the final

seven batters and striking out five to record his first save of the season.

Doyle also made history, breaking Tennessee's single-season strikeout record with 158, surpassing Luke Hochevar's mark of 154 set in 2005. Tennessee had four players named to the Knoxville All-Regional Team, including Doyle, who was honored as the tournament's Most Outstanding Player. Fischer, Dean Curley, and Marin also earned spots. Under head coach Tony Vitello, the Vols are now 17–3 in NCAA regional play and an impressive 12–1 at home regionals since his arrival.

Tennessee will face Arkansas in Fayetteville this weekend in a highly anticipated rematch. The Razorbacks took two of three from the Vols in their regular-season series. Super Regional schedules will be released Tuesday at 10 a.m. ET via NCAA Baseball's social media channels. *Source: UTSports.com*

Lane closure planned on U.S. Hwy 68 at Watts Bar Dam starting June 9



The Tennessee Valley Authority (TVA) has announced that one lane of U.S. Highway 68 across Watts Bar Dam will be closed for approximately two weeks beginning **Monday**, **June 9**, to allow for bridge maintenance work.

Crews will be performing

bridge deck repairs and applying an epoxy overlay to the roadway. While the bridge will remain open to traffic, motorists should expect delays as traffic will be managed by **portable traffic control signals**.

The project is scheduled for completion by **Friday**, **June 20**, though TVA notes the timeline may shift depending on weather or other unforeseen factors.
