Head-On Collision Reported in McMinn County on Wednesday Afternoon



A head-on collision involving two vehicles occurred Wednesday afternoon, June 4, around 2:00 p.m., at the intersection of County Road 172 and County Road 180.

The crash involved a red Chevrolet Silverado 3500 dually pickup truck and a silver Ford Focus. Each vehicle was occupied by a single driver, and both sustained only minor injuries, according to first responders.

Preliminary reports indicate the Chevrolet truck crossed the center line, resulting in the collision.

Emergency personnel from the Clearwater Rural Fire Department, McMinn County Sheriff's Department, AMR, and the Tennessee Highway Patrol responded to the scene. Trooper Gordon Roberts of the THP is leading the investigation.

AUB Announces Changes to Service Cut- Off Procedures Effective July 1

The Athens Utilities Board (AUB) is updating its utility service cut-off procedures in an effort to streamline operations and ensure fair treatment for all customers. The new policies will take effect July 1, 2025.

Under the updated guidelines, all payment agreements must be finalized by the close of business the day *before* a customer's scheduled service cut-off date. AUB will no longer accept payment agreements on the day of a scheduled disconnection.

In addition, payments must be received by 7:29 a.m. on the morning of a customer's cut-off date in order to avoid service interruption and associated reconnect fees.

"This change will allow our accounting department to operate more efficiently and apply processes consistently across the board," said Michelle Millsaps, AUB Superintendent of Accounting. "We value our customers and are committed to providing fair and timely service to everyone."

AUB is encouraging any customers who may need to make payment arrangements to contact the office well in advance of their cut-off date to avoid disruption of service.

Motorists are advised to use extreme caution and watch for traffic signage, workers, and pedestrians. Motorists should allocate additional time for traffic delays when traveling in this area.


The purpose of this notice is for road surface improvements.

Two people were injured Thursday when a pickup truck struck a trailer at the intersection of Highway 411 South and County Road 801 near Greenhill Cemetery.


According to officials, the driver of a 1999 Ford F-350 pulling a trailer loaded with a Bobcat was exiting the cemetery when a 2002 Dodge Dakota collided with the rear of the trailer. The driver and passenger of the Dodge Dakota were transported by AMR to Starr Regional Medical Center in Etowah for treatment.



Emergency crews from Etowah Rural Fire Department, Etowah City Fire Department, Englewood Rural Fire Department, and the Etowah City Police Department responded to the scene. Etowah Rural Deputy Chief Dustin Ruebush was in command of the response.

The crash is under investigation by Tennessee Highway Patrol Trooper Travis Ryans.
