Unsolved Tragedy: McMinn County Woman Fatally Stabbed, One Year Later Questions Remain



More than a year after 24-year-old Diamond Natasha Young was found critically injured on a rural road, her death remains unsolved — and her loved ones are still waiting for justice.

On the evening of April 26, 2023, a couple traveling along County Road 725 in McMinn County discovered Young lying in the roadway, suffering from multiple stab wounds to her neck. Despite her grave injuries, evidence suggests she had fought to survive — reportedly using her own shirt in an attempt to stop the bleeding.

The couple immediately called for help and stayed by her side until emergency responders arrived. Young was transported to UT Morning Fax Medical Center in Knoxville, where she clung to life for several days. Tragically, she succumbed to her injuries on April 30, 2023.

Young's death shocked the community. Her obituary described her as a loving and devoted friend and family member, leaving many to question what led to such a violent end — and who is responsible. To date, no arrests have been made in the case. Authorities continue to investigate and urge anyone with information to come forward.

TBI Investigates Officer-Involved Shooting in Sweetwater

The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation is conducting an independent probe into an officer-involved shooting that occurred early Wednesday morning in Sweetwater, following a request from 10th Judicial District Attorney General Stephen Hatchett.

The incident took place around 12:55 a.m. at a residence on Camp Hill Road. Monroe County deputies had responded to reports of a man experiencing a mental health crisis. Upon arrival, the man reportedly displayed a weapon and then retreated into the home. Negotiators attempted to de-escalate the situation, but when those efforts failed, tear gas was deployed. The man then opened the door and fired a shot. A Madisonville police officer, who was part of a Special Response Team assisting at the scene, returned fire and struck the man.

Officers rendered aid at the scene until EMS arrived and transported the man to the hospital. His condition has not been publicly released. No officers were injured during the incident. TBI agents are now working to piece together the chain of events by collecting evidence and conducting interviews. The agency emphasized that its role is to gather facts, not to determine whether the use of force was justified. That decision will be made by the District Attorney General upon reviewing the findings.

As standard procedure, the TBI has not released the names of the officers involved. Any further updates will be made available through the TBI's official website at *TBINewsroom.com*

New Video Raises Questions in Death of Monroe County Inmate Elijah Lester Isbill



New body camera footage has surfaced surrounding the arrest and detainment of 74-year-old Elijah Lester Isbill, shedding new light on the final hours before his death in the Monroe County Justice Center in February 2025. Isbill's daughter, Windy Duncan, has accused Monroe County corrections staff of mistreating her father, who died hours after being taken into custody. She posted videos of the incident online, claiming Isbill was physically abused while in jail custody.


In response, the Monroe County Sheriff's Office (MCSO) initially pushed back against the allegations. However, the release of internal body camera footage from MCSO on Friday appears to confirm some troubling details about Isbill's condition during the arrest and detention process. The footage shows Isbill appearing confused and struggling to

answer basic questions from officers. Despite his apparent disorientation, EMS personnel on scene reportedly advised that he was lucid, meaning his daughter could not exercise power of attorney.

MCSO claims that Duncan refused medical transport for her father by signing an Against Medical Advice (AMA) form, although Duncan has publicly stated she was never shown or given any such documentation — and her father was never transported. Additional jail surveillance footage shows a nurse checking on Isbill before he was placed in a restraint chair with a mesh hood over his head. Hours later, he was unresponsive. CPR was initiated, and Isbill was transported to Blount Memorial Hospital, where he was later pronounced dead. An autopsy revealed that Isbill suffered fractured ribs, as well as multiple contusions and abrasions. The cause of death was listed as cardiac arrhythmia, which the report states was not caused directly by his injuries.

In a statement release, Monroe County Sheriff Tommy Jones acknowledged concerns over the incident and confirmed that disciplinary action has been taken. One corporal was fired, and two other corrections deputies resigned before they could be formally terminated. Additional suspensions were handed down to another deputy and two sergeants. *Continued on Next Page*

Elijah Isbill (Continued)

Sheriff Jones noted that the jail's padded cell — where Isbill ideally would have been held — was undergoing maintenance, forcing officers to use a restraint chair instead. While the device's use is standard procedure in correctional settings, Jones admitted that the behavior seen in the video "does not align with the standards I uphold."

The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation (TBI) and <u>District Attorney General Stephen Hatchett</u> continue to investigate both the February incident and an earlier arrest of Isbill in May 2024 for DUI. That charge was later dismissed due to lack of probable cause. DA Hatchett noted that Isbill exhibited similar symptoms during both encounters, raising questions about how his condition was evaluated by law enforcement.

In his <u>statement.</u> Sheriff Jones extended condolences to the Isbill family and reaffirmed his commitment to accountability:

"I hope that my decisions demonstrate to his loved ones and the residents of Monroe County that I take my duty seriously and hold my deputies accountable for their actions."

As the investigation continues, the community — and Isbill's family — wait for further answers about the circumstances that led to his tragic death.
