

## Still Time to Join E.G. Fisher Library's Summer Reading Challenge



The Summer Reading Challenge at E.G. Fisher Public Library is in full swing, and there's still time to join the fun! Now through **Friday**, **July 18**, readers of all ages—children, teens, and adults—can log their reading to earn prizes and celebrate literacy.

Children ages 0–12 can participate in the new **Time Trackers** program by logging 30 minutes of reading per day. For every five days of reading, they earn a spin on the prize wheel, with up to 10 spins available. Bonus prizes and a goodie bag await those who complete the challenge. Teens in grades 6–12 earn a prize drawing entry for every 100 pages read. Participants also unlock mini-games and other opportunities, with winners notified weekly.

Adults (18+) can log books to gain entries into weekly prize drawings. Audiobooks and individual books of the Bible count, though picture books do not.

The program wraps up with a **Finale Party on Tuesday**, **July 22 at 4:30 PM**. Participation is free, and the program is made possible by generous donors and volunteers.

#### **Controlled Burn Spreads, Damages Garage in Etowah**



A controlled burn of an old outbuilding quickly got out of hand Sunday morning on County Road 511, leading to a fire that damaged a nearby two-story garage.

According to emergency personnel, the property owner believed the structure would burn slowly.

However, the flames spread rapidly, igniting the adjacent garage. The fire caused significant roof and exterior damage, along with some interior water damage during firefighting efforts.

Fire crews from Etowah City, Etowah Rural, and Englewood Rural Fire Departments responded to the scene. Englewood Rural Fire Lt. Caleb Martin led incident command. The McMinn County Sheriff's Department and Etowah Utilities Board also assisted. No injuries were reported.

### Starr Regional Launches 'Special Delivery' Program to Improve Postpartum Care

Starr Regional Medical Center has launched the Special Delivery Program, a new initiative aimed at improving postpartum care and reducing maternal mortality. As part of the program, postpartum patients receive wristbands to wear for six weeks after giving birth. The wristbands serve as a reminder for patients, families, and healthcare providers to monitor for complications that can arise in the weeks following delivery.

The program underscores the hospital's commitment to early intervention and postpartum health awareness. According to the CDC, 53% of pregnancy-related deaths occur between 7 and 365 days postpartum, with the U.S. maternal mortality rate significantly higher than in other high-income countries.

The Special Delivery wristbands help identify postpartum patients during medical visits, reducing the risk of misdiagnosis and ensuring timely care. The initiative also encourages families and community members to regularly check in with new mothers and support their recovery.

The wristbands do not replace scheduled postpartum visits but serve as an added layer of support during recovery. For more information, visit <u>StarrRegional.com/special-delivery</u>.
