# **TBI Investigating Officer-Involved Shooting in Cleveland**



The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation is looking into an officer-involved shooting that occurred late Sunday night in Cleveland, at the request of 10th Judicial District Attorney General Stephen Hatchett.

According to preliminary reports, the incident happened around 11:23 p.m. at a gas station in the 4100 block of APD 40. A Cleveland Police officer was attempting to serve a warrant on a female passenger inside a vehicle. When the officer reached into the car, the male driver sped away, dragging the officer. In response, the officer fired his weapon, striking the

driver before being thrown from the vehicle. The officer sustained minor injuries. Around 1:33 a.m. Monday, Bradley County deputies located the vehicle and the injured driver at a residence on Sipes Road. The driver was taken to a hospital with non-life-threatening injuries. The woman wanted on the outstanding warrant had not been located at the time of this report.

TBI agents are continuing to collect evidence and conduct interviews to determine the sequence of events. The findings

will be turned over to the District Attorney General, who will decide whether the officer's actions were justified. The TBI does not determine the legality of an officer's actions and does not release the names of officers involved in such cases.
