# **Southeast Tennessee Drug Bust Includes Locals**

A series of investigations by the 10th Judicial District Drug Task Force and others beginning in early 2024 has come to an end recently with Federal indictments being obtained on fourteen individuals.

The investigation began in the 10th Judicial District and led to indictments and arrests in areas across the Southeast that include Athens, Etowah, Sweetwater, Chattanooga, Atlanta, and even into Mexico. During these investigations approximately 22 pounds of Methamphetamine, 13,900 Fentanyl pills, 136 grams of Fentanyl powder, 56 firearms, 4 vehicles, and \$60,453 in US currency was seized.

The 14 individuals below were all indicted in the Eastern District Federal Court of Tennessee for various charges relating to methamphetamine, fentanyl, and firearms. Arrested in Indictments:

Indictments remain outstanding on one suspect from Atlanta Georgia and one suspect from Mexico. Those names are being withheld until arrests are made. This case shows what can happen when local, state, and federal agencies work together for a common goal," says DTF Director Bill Cherry. Director Cherry wished to mention and thank the following agencies who cooperated in the investigation and subsequent operations: 10th Judicial District Drug Task Force, US Drug Enforcement Agency, US Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, and Firearms, US Marshal Service, Tennessee Bureau of Investigations, Athens Police Department, McMinn

#### City Council to Discuss Park Upgrades, Public Safety, and Downtown Planning



The Athens City Council will convene for its regular meeting on **Tuesday**, **July 15 at 6 p.m.** in the Burkett L. Witt Council Chambers.

The meeting will include a **special recognition for the late Randy Sliger**, who will be honored posthumously with the VIVID Award for his service to the community.

Several key items on the agenda include:

•Land and engineering approvals to support infrastructure projects like stormwater upgrades and the View Street extension.

•Major investments in public facilities, including new police and public works vehicles, and IT system updates.

•Downtown revitalization planning, with consultants preparing new schematic designs and a pattern book to guide future growth.

•Parks improvements, including plans to turf five infields and renovate a house at Regional Park for office space.

•Public safety initiatives, such as a grant for the School Resource Officer program and updates to fire and building codes.

Additional business includes sidewalk planning on Hammerhill Road, new benches and banners for local parks, and the reappointment of Sam Stephens to the city planning commission.

City officials will also present departmental reports and updates on ongoing projects, with time set aside for public comment.

The meeting is open to the public.

### Sales Tax Holiday Coming Up Soon

Tennessee shoppers will have the chance to save on back-to-school essentials during the state's annual sales tax holiday, which begins at 12:01 a.m. on Friday, July 25, and ends at 11:59 p.m. on Sunday, July 27, 2025. The tax-free weekend allows consumers to purchase clothing, school supplies, and computers without paying state or local sales tax — with some restrictions. The holiday is aimed at helping families prepare for the upcoming school year while saving money on essential items. Purchases made online also qualify, provided they are for personal use and not for business or resale. What's Covered? Clothing: Tax-exempt items include general apparel priced at \$100 or less per item, such as shirts, pants, socks, shoes, and dresses. However, luxury or specialty items like jewelry, handbags, and sports equipment are not eligible. Items that are normally sold together, like shoe pairs, must be under the \$100 threshold in total to qualify. School Supplies: Common school and art supplies such as binders, backpacks, crayons, pens, paper, and paintbrushes are tax-free if priced at \$100 or less per item. The exemption does not apply to supplies exceeding this amount or bundled items that surpass the limit. Computers: Personal-use desktop, laptop, and tablet computers priced at \$1,500 or less are included in the holiday. However, computer accessories like flash drives, printers, software, and printer ink do not qualify. Tennessee's taxfree weekend occurs annually before the start of the school year. Shoppers are encouraged to check receipts, shop early, and review full guidelines at https://www.tn.gov/revenue for complete details and eligibility information.
