

#### Athens Utilities Board to Hold July 22 Meeting, Elect New Officers



The Athens Utilities Board (AUB) will convene for its regular monthly meeting TODAY, Tuesday, July 22, at 5:00 p.m., with several items on the agenda, including the election of new officers and consideration of a proposed policy change.

The meeting will begin with a public comment period for preapproved speakers, followed by the election of board officers, including Chairperson, Vice Chairperson, Secretary, and Budget and Finance Committee Chair. The board will also appoint its legal representative and name an AUB representative to the McMinn County Economic Development Authority.

Other items include approval of the June 24 meeting minutes, a review of the monthly financial statement, and updates from each AUB division. The board will also review bids to replace Vehicle #45 in the Wastewater Division. The meeting will conclude with the Manager's Report, highlighting updates on ongoing projects and utility operations.

#### TWU Study Abroad in Costa Rica



This summer, a group of Tennessee Wesleyan University students embarked on a transformative four-week language and culture immersion program in Costa Rica, designed to strengthen Spanish language skills and deepen cultural understanding.

The program was centered in San José, the nation's capital. Students immersed themselves in daily life by engaging with locals in the streets, markets, parks, and restaurants. They visited cultural landmarks including the National Museum, the Costa Rican Art Museum, and a butterfly garden. Two of the most memorable highlights

in San José were a guided tour with a biologist from the University of Costa Rica, where students explored local plant and animal life, and attending a performance of Mujercitas (Little Women) at the National Theater.

Beyond the capital, students explored three additional cities within Costa Rica's Central Valley. Highlights included the Juan Santamaría Museum in Alajuela, the historic Fortín de Heredia, and the Basilica of Our Lady of the Angels in Cartago. #### **Breedlove Signs with New York Yankees**



Austin Breedlove, former player for the Cleveland State Community College baseball team, has signed an undrafted free agent deal with the New York Yankees. Breedlove was a pitcher on the Cleveland State team during the 2024 season and transferred to Tony Vitello's team at the University of Tennessee, Knoxville (UTK) before the 2025 season.

While at Cleveland State, Breedlove earned Power Pitcher of the Year honors while also becoming a Second Team All-Conference player. He appeared in 15 games with 13 starts, throwing 82.0 innings and totaling 123 strikeouts. He posted a 4.3 ERA and a 1.2 WHIP for the season.

"Austin was a major part of our 2024 season in which we finished runner up in the state," said Aaron Bryant, Cleveland State Baseball Head Coach. "He led the country in strikeouts for 90% of the season. We are thrilled and excited for what the future holds for him in professional baseball!"

The Ooltewah native graduated from McCallie School. While at UTK for the 2025 season, Breedlove had an ERA of 13.50 in eight outings during SEC games; he struck out six and allowed three walks in 4.0 innings as conference opponents hit .375 off him.

#### Man Found Dead in Loudon County in 2019 Identified Through Forensic Genealogy



Authorities have identified human remains discovered in 2019 near Interstate 75 in Philadelphia as those of John Arthur Troutman, a man originally from Herndon, Pennsylvania, thanks to advanced DNA testing and a partnership between multiple law enforcement and forensic agencies.

The remains were found on August 20, 2019, by a Tennessee Department of Transportation crew working along I-75. The Loudon County Sheriff's Office and the Knox County Regional Forensic Center began an investigation but were initially unable to identify the man, who was listed as John Doe for nearly five years.

Earlier this year, the case was taken up by the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation's Cold Case and Unidentified Human Remains Initiative. A sample was sent to Othram, a private DNA lab in Texas, for forensic genealogical testing. In July, Othram linked the DNA to potential rela-

tives in North Carolina and Pennsylvania, who confirmed they hadn't seen their brother since the 1980s. Follow-up DNA comparisons confirmed the man's identity as John Arthur Troutman, born January 1, 1952.

Troutman's cause and manner of death remain undetermined, and authorities are now asking for the public's help in learning more about what brought him to Loudon County and the circumstances surrounding his death.

Funding for the DNA testing was made possible through a 2024 Community Project Funding request by U.S. Congressman Tim Burchett, administered through the Bureau of Justice Assistance.
