### **Driver Arrested for DUI After Early Morning Crash on I-75**

A 21-year-old male was arrested for DUI and other charges early Thursday morning following a crash on Interstate 75 southbound at the 58-mile marker.

The incident occurred just after midnight when a latemodel Honda Civic left the roadway and struck a tree in the median. The driver, found to be intoxicated, was evaluated by AMR before being transported to the McMinn County Justice Center.

Responding agencies included the Tennessee Highway Patrol, McMinn County Sheriff's Department, Niota Rural Fire Department, and AMR. Chad Gates was in command at the scene, and THP Trooper Freeman is leading the investigation.

### **AACA Opens Registration for Fall Art Classes**

The Athens Area Council for the Arts (AACA) is now accepting registrations for a variety of handson art classes for all ages and experience levels. From ceramics to painting, the fall lineup includes both one-day workshops and multi-week courses, all held at The Arts Center in downtown Athens.

#### **Ceramics Offerings**

Kids ages 9–13 can join *Kids Ceramics with Patricia Shook* on Saturday, August 2 to craft a textured clay mug (\$35, includes materials). For adults, Shook will lead several beginner-friendly pottery classes including *Date Night Pottery, Get Your Hands Dirty: Pottery Wheel*, and *Build a Mug*, with sessions scheduled throughout August and September (\$75–\$85 per class).

Those seeking more in-depth instruction can register for Shook's *Handbuilding Pottery* (Tuesdays, Sept. 16–Oct. 28) or *Pottery Wheel* (Thursdays, Sept. 18–Oct. 30). These seven-week classes cost \$175–\$200 and include all materials.

#### **Painting Class**

For aspiring painters, *Beginning Acrylic Painting with Chris Ingram* runs Thursdays, August 7–September 11, for ages 16 and up. Students will learn core techniques while creating their own acrylic artwork. The six-week course is \$200, all supplies provided.

Participants must register at least three days prior to class start dates.
