#### Polk County Man Tried to Bomb Deputies During Arrest, Authorities Say



A Polk County man is facing a long list of criminal charges after authorities discovered 14 improvised explosive devices in his home during an arrest on Friday, August 1.

Deputies with the Polk County Sheriff's Office arrested Kevin Wade O'Neal, 54, at his residence on Amber Way in Old Fort while serving warrants related to threats he allegedly made against local law enforcement and public officials. According to a news release from the sheriff's office, deputies noticed a smoldering object inside the bedroom where O'Neal was found. Upon further inspection, they spotted what appeared to be an improvised explosive device. The home was evacuated, and the Chattanooga Police Department Bomb Squad, along with federal agents from the Bureau of Alcohol, Tobacco, Firearms and Explosives (ATF), were called to the scene.



A search of the residence led authorities to 14 homemade explosive devices. Investigators believe O'Neal attempted to detonate them as deputies arrived to arrest him. O'Neal has been charged with nine counts of attempted first-degree murder for allegedly trying to kill the deputies and detectives involved in the arrest, as well as two additional counts of attempted first-degree murder for others who were present at the time. He also faces 14 counts of prohibited weapons violations and one count of possession of explosive components. O'Neal is currently being held at the Polk County Jail. His bond has not yet been set.

Polk County Sheriff Steve Ross expressed gratitude to the multiple agencies that responded, including West Polk Fire and Rescue, AmeriPro EMS, the Tennessee Highway Patrol, the 10th Judicial District Drug Task Force, ATF agents, the Chattanooga Police Bomb Squad, and the Tennessee Department of Homeland Security. *Source: Polk Co.
