More Information Released on Suspect Arrested in Deadly Athens Shooting




An arrest warrant reveals new details about the moments after a deadly shooting in Athens Wednesday that later led to the capture of a suspect in Bradley County Thursday. Last Friday, an arrest warrant says Athens Police responded to Harris and Leveck Street in reference to a shots fired call. Dispatchers notified officers that one of the victims had checked himself into Starr Regional ER for his wounds. According to the warrant, officers on scene heard loud screams from the backyard of a residence. The officers found a witness near a second shooting victim. The warrant says that victim, a juvenile, died from wounds to the chest and arm. The witness told officers he heard several gunshots then a pause, followed by a couple of more gunshots. The warrant says he searched the area and found the second victim lying on his back a few feet away from a tent on his property. The witness told officers that when he heard the gunshots, he observed a male running towards the railroad tracks wearing red ball shorts and a dark colored t-shirt. The warrant says the witness then called 911 and waited on police and EMS to arrive due to his friend being shot. Detectives found a black pistol lying

in the backyard of a home on Harris Street. Officers received verbal consent to search the area around the house and an outbuilding on the homeowner's property. While checking the outbuilding for potential evidence, the warrant says detectives found a small Glock magazine lying on the floor with bullets loaded in the magazine and four spent 9mm shell casings lying on the floor. Moving towards the front of the residence, officers found two spent 9mm shell casings lying on the grass portion of the driveway. Surveillance video identified the shooter as Carlos Quintana. (see photo) Footage showed Quintana taking off on foot towards the train tracks and running towards the outbuilding and then towards Tell Street. The surviving victim was seen on camera slowly running towards a neighbor, who flags down a vehicle, and gets a ride to the hospital. Quintana was found hiding in a house in Bradley County Thursday night. Sheriff Joe Guy says they assisted Athens Police along with ATF, Drug Task Force, US Marshals, the TBI, and the Bradley County Sheriff's Office with arresting Quintana. He was taken to the McMinn County Jail and booked under a \$1,000,000 bond. It was discov-

ered that Quintana is a convicted felon in McMinn County with recent probation violations and was arrested in 2022 by Athens Police for attempted robbery. Investigators are also searching for a second unidentified suspect. Charges are pending for the second suspect pending additional digital forensic evidence which is being processed. *Source: NewsChannel9*

Athens Council to Tackle Park, Street, and Safety Projects in Meeting Today



The Athens City Council will hold a work session today, August 11 at 5 p.m. to cover a wide range of city projects and initiatives. The meeting will feature presentations from the Athens Area Council for the Arts, the Council Advisory Committee, and Wold Architects & Engineers regarding Fire Station #3. Council will discuss the installation

of poles and banners at Veterans Park, the sale of property at 2201 Decatur Pike, and bids for Heritage Park renovations and resurfacing nearly four miles of city streets.

Other topics include a retail package store compliance application, downtown property acquisition for parking and dumpster consolidation, amendments to court costs, and declaring surplus fire hose equipment. Resolutions on health and safety grant programs, the Hammerhill Road sidewalk survey results, and the purchase of replacement garbage dumpsters are also on the agenda.

The session will close with councilmember updates, including appointments, street light installations, cemetery signage improvements, and election-related charter amendments, before concluding with board and committee matters.

Two Injured in Construction Fall Near Niota



Two men were injured Saturday afternoon after falling from a roof during a construction project on County Road 267.

The incident occurred around 2:00 p.m. in the 500 block, where authorities say both men, in their 30s, fell approximately 12 to 14 feet.

Fire crews stabilized the patients at the scene before transport. One man was taken by ambulance to the University of Tennessee Medical Center, while the other was airlifted by Life Force helicopter to the same facility.

Responding agencies included AMR, Niota Rural Fire Department, North McMinn Rural Fire Department, and Life Force. Niota Fire Department served as incident command, with the helicopter landing in a nearby field.

According to authorities, the crash occurred around 8:30 a.m. when the driver of a


2006 Peterbilt tractor was waiting at a traffic light for bridge construction. The Subaru's driver failed to stop and struck the rear of the tractor.
