AUB Wastewater Team Earns State Awards for Decades of Excellence

The Athens Utilities Board's wastewater operations team has once again been honored among the best in the region, earning multiple Operational Excellence Awards from the Kentucky-Tennessee Water Environment Association at the recent Water Professionals Conference. The North Mouse Creek Wastewater Treatment Plant received the award for the 29th consecutive year, while the Oostanaula Wastewater Treatment Plant earned its 20th straight recognition — a notable achievement for the utility's ger

and more complex facility. The Operational Excellence Award recognizes treatment plants that maintain compliance with National Pollutant Discharge Elimination System permit requirements, allowing no more than one violation during a 12-month period. The North Mouse Creek plant treats up to 1.2 million gallons of wastewater daily, while the Oostanaula facility processes up to 6 million gallons, with peak capacities of 15 million gallons. AUB leaders credit the team's long-running success to proactive maintenance, constant monitoring, and seamless teamwork. While often unnoticed by the public, wastewater operations play a critical role in protecting public health and the environment. AUB's decades of recognition highlight the technical expertise, dedication, and cooperative culture that keep the community's waterways clean and safe year-round. *Source: Amy McDonald, AUB*

Dollar General Recalls Clover Valley Instant Coffee Over Glass Contamination Risk



Dollar General Corporation has issued a recall for select lots of its Clover Valley Instant Coffee after concerns the products may contain glass fragments. The recall affects three lots of the 8-ounce Clover Valley Instant Coffee — UPC 876941004069 — sold exclu-

sively in Dollar General stores between July 9 and July 21 in every state except Alaska and Hawaii. The affected lot numbers and best-by dates are: L-5163 (12/13/2026), L-5164 (12/13/2026), and L-5165 (12/14/2026).

According to the U.S. Food and Drug Administration, ingesting glass fragments can cause serious injuries, including damage to teeth, cuts to the mouth or throat, and intestinal perforation. The recall was initiated after a customer reported the potential contamination. No injuries or illnesses have been reported as of August 12. Dollar General is investigating the source of the issue and urges customers who purchased the affected products to discard them and contact the company for a full refund. **Source:** Newsweek
