Cleveland Police Promote First Female, Hispanic Captain



The Cleveland Police Department has announced the promotion of **Lieutenant Evie Lastra West** to the rank of Captain, marking a historic milestone as she becomes the first female and the first Hispanic to hold the position in the department's history.

Capt. West began her career with the department in 1999 as a volunteer Reserve Officer and its sole English/Spanish interpreter. Over the years, she has served in a variety of roles, including School Resource Officer, Public Information Officer, and Community Relations Unit Lieutenant.

Her new responsibilities include overseeing all School Resource Officers, the Cleveland Housing Authority Officer, the Crisis Intervention Team, Training and Accreditation, and Community Engagement initiatives—while continuing as the department's spokesperson.

"Rising through the ranks, she has held diverse assignments," the department said. "This promotion makes her the first female and the first Hispanic to hold the rank of Police Captain in the department's history."

Capt. West holds a master's degree in Public Safety from Tennessee Tech University, teaches as an adjunct professor at Tennessee Wesleyan University, and is a Teaching Associate with the University of Tennessee Law Enforcement Innovation Center's Institute for Public Safety.

The department described her as "a recognized servant leader" who has guided the agency through high-profile incidents, strengthened community relations, and built lasting programs to foster trust between law enforcement and the public.

Tennessee Wesleyan Graduate Honors Late Father's Legacy



When Jayden Scott graduated from Tennessee Wesleyan University this month with a degree in criminal justice and a minor in chemistry, she honored the memory of her father, Deputy Sheriff Jason Scott, who was killed in the line of duty in 2004 just days before her birth. Deputy Scott served with the Loudon County Sheriff's Office and was only 24 when he died while responding to a domestic disturbance. A section of Interstate 75 is named in his memory, but his daughter is carrying his legacy even further.

Surrounded by her "Blue Line family" growing up, Jayden knew she wanted to follow the same path of service. After discovering an interest in forensics, she pursued internships with the Knoxville Police Department and Knox County Sheriff's Office, logging more than 170 hours alongside crime scene investigators and forensic specialists. Her experiences solidified her career goal of becoming a crime scene investigator.

Now a TWU alumna, she is applying to law enforcement agencies across Tennessee, determined to serve and carry on her family's legacy. *Edited from Release Submitted by Chrisi Jackson, TWU*
