



- The Athens Utilities Board will meet Wednesday, August 26, at 5 p.m. Agenda items include pension plan management changes, financial reports, equipment purchase bids, and a United Way contribution. A public comment period for pre-approved speakers will also be held.
- Gas prices increased across nearly all of Tennessee's metro areas last week, with the state average now at \$2.77 per gallon, according to AAA. Knoxville was the only metro area to avoid an increase. Despite the recent uptick, prices remain nearly 20 cents lower than this time last year. Nationally, the average price is \$3.16, up three cents from last week but 19 cents lower than a year ago. Crude oil inventories also declined by six million barrels, with U.S. reserves now 6% below the five-year seasonal average. Locally, averages are \$2.76 in McMinn County, \$2.72 in Monroe County, and \$2.79 in Meigs County.

No. 18 Tennessee, Syracuse Set to Clash in Season Opener at Mercedes-Benz Stadium



No. 18 Tennessee opens its 2025 football season Saturday against **Syracuse** in a neutral-site matchup at Mercedes-Benz Stadium in Atlanta. Kickoff is set for **noon EDT on ABC**, with former Vols linebacker **Al Wilson** serving as honorary game captain.


The Volunteers enter the game favored by **13.5 points** (FanDuel) and holding an **88.6 percent chance to win**, according to ESPN's FPI. Tennessee also leads the all-time series, **3-0**, including a 33-9 win in the last meeting on Sept. 1, 2001, at Neyland Stadium.

Both teams are coming off 10-3 campaigns in 2024, with Tennessee reaching the **College Football Playoff** and Syracuse claiming a **Holiday Bowl victory**. But both programs lost their star offensive leaders—Vols running back Dylan Sampson (NFL) and Orange quarterback Kyle McCord (NFL)—and are breaking in new quarterbacks.

For Tennessee, that's **Joey Aguilar**, a UCLA transfer who previously starred at Appalachian State, where he threw for 6,760 yards and 56 touchdowns in two seasons. Syracuse counters with **Steve Angeli**, a Notre Dame transfer known for his efficiency, completing 72.5 percent of his passes with 10 touchdowns to just one interception in limited action.

Defensively, Tennessee will again lean on one of the nation's top units, even without NFL first-round pick James Pearce Jr. Preseason All-American cornerback **Jermod McCoy** is expected to play limited snaps as he works back from an ACL injury. Syracuse will need Angeli's steady play to neutralize the Vols' pressure and secondary.

The season opener has been ranked the **third-best matchup of Week 1** by SEC Network's Peter Burns. While Tennessee is the heavy favorite, the neutral-site setting in Atlanta could give Syracuse an opening to keep things closer than the experts predict. **Sources: Jordan Binkley, BlitzSportsMedia.com//Dan Harralson, Vols Wire**
