Controlled Burn Sparks Outbuilding Fire in Etowah



Fire crews were dispatched shortly after 12:30 p.m. Saturday to reports of black smoke in the area of County Road 813. Upon arrival, firefighters found an outbuilding fully engulfed in flames.

Investigators said the blaze started when a controlled burn on the property spread, accidentally igniting the structure. The building was declared a total loss.

Responding agencies included Etowah City Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, and EUB. Etowah Rural Assistant Fire Chief Kevin Elliott served as incident commander.

McMinn EDA Hosts Annual Meeting, Honors Community Leaders



Athens Planning Commission to Meet Today at 12 p.m.

The Athens Municipal-Regional Planning Commission will hold its regular meeting on Tuesday, Sept. 2, at 12 p.m. in the Athens City Council Chambers. The agenda includes approval of minutes from the July 7 regular meeting and the July 28 work session. Items of new business include:

- •Final plat approval for Christian M. and Cayla A. Medders to reconfigure four lots into two on South Jackson Street (Tax Map 066 H, Group B, Parcels 028.00, 029.00, 030.00, and 031.00).
- •Final plat approval for Mesana Investments LLC for a 40-lot development on 8.43 acres located off Shadows Lawn Drive (Tax Map 057, Parcel 086.00).
- •Plan of services recommendation for the annexation of the remaining 2.35-acre portion of Parcel 47K, Group A, Parcel 022.00, located off Lee Drive.
- •Rezoning request by the City of Athens to rezone 2201 Decatur Pike (Tax Map 056, Parcel 009.00) from B-3 Intensive Business District to R-2 Medium Density Residential District. The property covers approximately 1.08 acres.
- •A proclamation honoring the Late Janice Hardaway for 12 years of service on the Planning Commission.

Vols Roll Past Syracuse in Season Opener 45-26, Turn Focus to ETSU



No. 24/18 Tennessee opened its 2025 football season with a statement win Saturday afternoon, powering past Syracuse, 45-26, in the Aflac Kickoff Game at Mercedes-Benz Stadium. The Volunteers (1-0) jumped out early with 17 first-quarter points, highlighted by a 2-yard touchdown run from sophomore Peyton Lewis and a defensive score from transfer cornerback Colton Hood, who scooped up a forced fumble and returned it 22 yards.

Quarterback Joey Aguilar, making his debut in orange and white, kept the offense rolling. After Syracuse closed the gap to 24-14 late in the first half, Aguilar connected with Braylon Staley for a 73-yard touchdown strike, and DeSean Bishop added a 1-yard score just before halftime to give Tennessee a 31-14 cushion.

The defense delivered again to open the second half as linebacker Jeremiah Telander intercepted a tipped pass, setting up Aguilar's 7-yard touchdown toss to running back Star Thomas. Syracuse cut the margin to 12 early in the fourth quarter, but Aguilar answered with a two-yard touchdown pass to Miles Kitselman to put the game away. Aguilar finished 16-of-28 for 247 yards and three touchdowns. Staley

led receivers with 95 yards on four catches, while Thomas and Bishop combined for 174 rushing yards and two touchdowns. Defensively, Arion Carter posted nine tackles, including a sack, while the Vols piled up five sacks and seven tackles for loss overall. Tennessee totaled 493 yards of offense and was a perfect 5-for-5 in the red zone.

Head coach Josh Heupel praised his team's effort against Syracuse but emphasized the need for growth.

"Pleased with the win from Saturday, but today's about how we get better and move forward," Heupel said Monday. "ETSU, you look at how they performed on Saturday, a bunch of yards, a bunch of points, and they did some really good things on the defensive side of the ball too."

Aguilar drew praise from his coach for his calm decision-making and composure in his debut. The running game also shined, churning out 246 yards as all three primary backs reached the end zone. Tennessee will look to extend its streak of season-opening victories to six years when it takes the field at Neyland Stadium against East Tennessee State University on Saturday, Sept. 6 at 3:30 p.m., SECN+/ESPN+. **Source:** <u>UTSports.com</u>
