Unemployment Rates Fall in McMinn County, Athens Area

Unemployment rates declined across Tennessee in August, including in McMinn County and the Athens Micropolitan Area, according to new figures from the Tennessee Department of Labor and Workforce Development.

McMinn County posted a 4.4% jobless rate in August, down from 5.5% in July and lower than the 4.8% recorded a year ago. The Athens Micropolitan Area, which includes McMinn and Meigs counties, reported a 4.5% unemployment rate, dropping 1.1 percentage points from July.

Meigs County's rate stood at 5.1% in August, down from 6.1% the previous month.

Statewide, all 95 counties saw decreases in unemployment from July to August, with 90 counties posting rates below 5%. Sevier County recorded the state's lowest rate at 2.7%, while Perry County had the highest at 5.4%. Tennessee's seasonally adjusted statewide rate was 3.6%.

The Tennessee Department of Labor encourages job seekers to use free resources available at American Job Centers, which offer assistance with resumés, interviews, and access to job postings.

Pumpkintown has become one of the region's favorite festivals in the last 22 years with plenty of activities for young and old. The festival hours will be 10:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m. These activities and more help festival goers celebrate history, heritage and culture:

The Scott Crisp Memorial PowWow is dedicated to the memory of Scott Crisp, a beloved committee member of Pumpkintown until his untimely death in 2016. The beat of the native drum and the notes of the flute will lead you down to Market Park where you will experience blow gun demonstrations, tribal dancers and Native American crafts.

Another fan favorite is the McMinn Regional Humane Society's Adopt-a-Thon and Pet Costume Contest. Registration for the costume contest begins at 10:00 a.m. at the Market Park Water Wheel which is followed by the infamous Mutt Strutt at 10:45. The McMinn County Living Heritage Museum's 41st Annual Quilt Show will be available to Pumpkintown attendees free of charge from 10:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m. This award winning show produced by the Heritage Quilt Guild will feature more than 100 quilts in a variety of categories. Athens native Charles R. Ware will be honored and remembered in several ways during Pumpkintown weekend. Over 70 of his fellow Navy veterans will be in Athens commemorating their service on the USS Charles R. Ware destroyer. Beginning at 10:00 a.m. at Veterans Park, there will be a commerative brick dedication ceremony honoring area veterans. The Veterans Brick Walkway was established in 2002 during the plaza renovation at Veterans Memorial Park. The walk was opened with more than 2,500 bricks, making it one of the largest veterans walk in the United States and today there are more than 4,000 bricks in the walkway. There will also be a special addition to the permanent Charles R. Ware exhibit at the Living Heritage Museum to honor Lt. Ware.

Another highlight of Pumpkintown is Pumpkin Plinko. On North Jackson Street, one of the largest Plinko games in the world is set up by Athens Parks and Recreation and will be manned this year by Victory Volleyball Academy. Young and old alike roll balls down the street through a maze of pumpkins where the object is to score a perfect 30 to win a prize!

Be sure to stop by The Arts Center on North White Street to check out the phenomenal new space and get your creative juices flowing with pumpkin paint starting at 11:00 a.m. until they run out of pumpkins. Then take a short walk across the street to Knight Park to check out Misfit Herd Mobile Petting Zoo and take a photo at the Pumpkin House created by Mayfield Farm Park!

In addition to all of the above, Pumpkintown will feature shopping at local merchants, live entertainment on three stages, a host of childrens' activities including pony rides, petting zoo and inflatibles at Market Park, carnival rides on West Madison, dinosaurs and bubble fun on Washington and 300 arts, crafts, info and food vendors.



Rep. Greg Vital Receives Chancellor's Award for Philanthropy



The Tennessee Board of Regents has honored State Rep. Greg A. Vital with the 2025 Chancellor's Award for Excellence in Philanthropy.

Cleveland State Community College nominated Vital for the award, citing his generosity and commitment to education and conservation. His donation established the Greg A. Vital Center for Natural Resources and Conservation inside the newly renovated Carl Hite Math and Science Building.

The Vital Center houses Cleveland State's Forestry, Wildlife and Fisheries program and Agriculture program. It also serves as a hub for students, educators, and professionals to collaborate on environmental challenges.

At the award presentation, Vital said, "We need to instill the importance of stewardship of our land and water and the special places we call home." He added, "It's exciting to see Tennessee grow... One of the important things people choose when they come to Tennessee is our quality of life."

Vital also noted, "They may not all go to work for the USDA or the Fish and Wildlife Service. They may go into education and become teachers. They may go into research." He said he was honored "to be in the legislature and fight for education in Tennessee, because it is our future."
