Wanted Fugitive Apprehended in Sweetwater



On October 1, 2025, Monroe County Sheriff's deputies, along with officers from the Sweetwater Police Department, successfully apprehended 45-year-old Michael John McLemore of Sweetwater, at his residence located at 132 Southside Road.

Deputies and officers arrived at the residence to serve active warrants (from both MCSO and SPD) for Mr. McLemore. Upon their arrival, Mr. McLemore initially refused to exit the home. A Monroe County Sheriff's Office negotiator was deployed to the scene and attempted to encourage Mr. McLemore to surrender peacefully. Sweetwater Police officers who were familiar with him also assisted in the negotiations.

As the Monroe County Sheriff's Office S.W.A.T. unit mobilized for response, Mr. McLemore eventually exited the residence voluntarily. He was taken into custody without incident.

Mr. McLemore was wanted on the following charges:

- Two counts of Aggravated Assault
- Two counts of Violation of Probation
- One count of Aggravated Robbery

He has been booked into the Monroe County Sheriff's Office Jail and is currently being held on these charges.

Vols Recharge During Bye Week, Eye Arkansas Showdown at Neyland



Fresh off a dramatic overtime win at Mississippi State, No. 15 Tennessee is using its first open date of the season to regroup, recover, and sharpen its play before hosting Arkansas on Oct. 11 at Neyland Stadium.

Head coach Josh Heupel praised his team's fight in Starkville but stressed the need for improvement across the board. "There are a lot of things that we can do a lot better... in every phase of the game," Heupel said. "Whether you win or lose, it's dealing with the reality and how you get better."

The bye week is also giving younger Vols more chances to step into bigger roles. True freshmen David Sanders Jr. and Jack Van Dorselaer earned recognition from Heupel after key contributions late against Mississippi State. Sanders handled his first game snaps "prepared for the moment," while Van Dorselaer "played with violence, speed and technique" on the overtime run that sealed the win.

Heupel also highlighted transfer wideout Chris Brazzell II's development, crediting his ability to "go and attack the ball, making plays" in one-on-one situations. The Vols' depth will be tested as they gear up for a physical SEC stretch.

Meanwhile, quarterback Joey Aguilar, who led Tennessee's offense in the Mississippi State win, was named to the 2025 Hispanic Football Hall of Fame College Football Watch List. Aguilar, of Mexican and Puerto Rican heritage, is among the top candidates for Hispanic College Football Player of the Year. Tennessee returns to action Oct. 11 for its only home game of the month, a critical SEC clash against Arkansas at Neyland Stadium. *Source: UTSports.com*
