Athens City Council to Review City Hall Expansion, Zoning Changes Monday

The Athens City Council will hold a work session Monday, October 13, at 5 p.m. to discuss a range of city projects and ordinances.

Major items include plans for City Hall renovations and expansion, and

the sale of city-owned property on Tellico Avenue. Council will also hold public hearings and readings on several ordinances, including one to rezone property at 2201 Decatur Pike for residential use and another updating floodplain management regulations to maintain eligibility in the National Flood Insurance Program.

Other business includes storm water code amendments, bid awards for HVAC replacements at Fire Station #2 and City Hall, and a new electronic gate at Regional Park.

The meeting will take place at the Athens Municipal Building and is open to the public.

One Injured in Rollover Crash Near Niota Thursday Night




A woman was injured Thursday night, October 9, after her 2001 Dodge pickup overturned on Highway 11 near County Road 324 in Niota.

State Officials Urge Caution as Tennessee Enters Wildfire Season



With Tennessee's annual wildfire season underway and National Fire Prevention Week being observed, the Tennessee Department of Agriculture Division of Forestry (TDF) is reminding residents to practice safe burning and obtain the required burn permits beginning October 15.

State Forester Heather Slayton said Tennessee averages about 1,000 wildland fires each year, burning roughly 18,000 acres, with more than 90% caused by humans. She noted that extra debris from Hurricane Helene could increase fire risks this season. "Getting a burn permit, burning safely, and avoiding risky activity can greatly reduce wildfire danger," Slayton said.

Burn permits help the Division of Forestry monitor when and where it is safe to burn. They are free and available online at www.BurnSafeTN.org or through the MyTN mobile app, issued daily from 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. local time. Burning without a permit is a Class C misdemeanor, and leaving a fire unattended is a Class B misdemeanor. Fires must be fully extinguished by the time the permit expires.

Residents without internet access can call 877-350-BURN (2876) Monday through Friday, 8 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Central. Officials encourage online applications due to high call volume. Those living within city limits should check local ordinances before burning and are urged to consider non-burning options for disposing of yard or storm debris. Information about burning restrictions and materials that are illegal to burn is available at www.tn.gov/environment/air/open-burning.html, or by calling 1-888-891-TDEC to report illegal burning.
