# Mystery and Mentorship Take the Stage at Athens Community Theatre





## Vols survive late rally to defeat Arkansas, 34–31

After twice battling back from early deficits, the No. 12 Tennessee Volunteers recovered three fumbles and rattled off 24 unanswered points to defeat Arkansas 34–31 Saturday night at Neyland Stadium in front of a sold-out Champions Weekend crowd of 101,915.

Running back Peyton Lewis led the charge with two touchdowns, including a 13-yard score early in the fourth quarter that gave the Vols a 34–17 lead. Arkansas answered with two late passing touchdowns, but Tennessee's offense ran out the final 2:55 behind clutch first downs from quarterback Joey Aguilar and Lewis to secure the win.

The Vols balanced attack totaled 485 yards, with 264 on the ground and 221 through the air. Freshman DeSean Bishop rushed for a career-high 146 yards and one touchdown, while receiver Braylon Staley caught six passes for 109 yards. Aguilar finished 16-of-25 with 221 passing yards and a touchdown.


Defensively, Tennessee's front line dominated, producing five sacks, nine tackles for loss, and three fumble recoveries. Standouts included Andre Turrentine with 11 tackles, Edrees Farooq with nine stops and a forced fumble, and Jordan Ross, who tallied 1.5 sacks and a key fumble recovery.

With the win, Tennessee improves to 5–1 overall and 2–1 in the SEC, while Arkansas falls to 2–4 (0–2 SEC).

Up next, the Vols travel to Tuscaloosa next Saturday, October 18, for their traditional "Third Saturday in October" rivalry game against Alabama. Kickoff is set for 7:30 p.m. ET on ABC.
