Shortly after 3:00 pm Tuesday, McMinn County Sheriff Joe Guy reported on social media that a small helicopter crashed and caught fire at the McMinn County Airport. The only person on board the helicopter was the pilot, who was injured. EMS personnel responded to the airport to treat the




thereafter along with a foam trailer and the Mutual Aid Fire Chief. A grass fire was extinguished where the helicopter landed. Source: Facebook

# Tennessee Wesleyan University Presents Romeo and Juliet


