

# **Blood Donation Rivalry Begins with Close First-Day Results**



Day one of the annual blood donation challenge between the Medic Regional Blood Center and the Kentucky Blood Center has come to a close, with the competition already proving tight. After the first day of collections, Kentucky holds a narrow lead with 412 donations, while Medic follows closely with 402.

Organizers say community support is crucial as the weeklong drive continues, and they encourage donors across the region to help boost Medic's numbers as the friendly rivalry moves forward.

"It was a great first day," said Kristy Altman, Vice President of Communications and Public Relations for Medic Regional Blood Center.

The competition continues throughout the week as both centers work to increase blood supplies while fueling the Tennessee–Kentucky matchup spirit. Go Vols!

### Gas Prices Steady Nationally; McMinn County Among Lowest

The national average for regular gasoline stayed flat this week at \$3.08, exactly the same as this time last year. Thanks to abundant crude oil supplies, prices have remained quiet throughout November, and analysts expect costs at the pump to stay steady—or even dip slightly—as Thanksgiving travel ramps up.

Gasoline demand saw a small increase from 8.87 million to 9.02 million barrels per day, while total domestic supply decreased to 205.1 million barrels. Production rose to 9.9 million barrels per day, according to new Energy Information Administration data. Crude oil prices also slipped, with WTI closing at \$58.49 a barrel. U.S. crude inventories climbed by 6.4 million barrels, though they remain about 4% below the five-year seasonal average.

Electric vehicle drivers saw a slight bump, too, with the national average for public charging nudging up one cent to 38 cents per kWh. Tennessee continues to be one of the least expensive states for gasoline at \$2.68, and McMinn County sits even lower at \$2.59, placing local prices among the most affordable in the nation. *Source:* AAA Fuel Prices

## **Englewood Rural FD Teaches Fire Safety to Englewood Elementary Students**



The Englewood Rural Fire Department recently visited Englewood Elementary School to provide hands-on fire prevention education to students, offering demonstrations and safety lessons aimed at preparing children for real-life emergencies.


Capt. Josh Roach led the first portion of the program, teaching students the fundamentals of fire safety and explaining how to stay safe during an emergency. Fire-fighter Gavin Garringer followed by showing students a full set of turnout gear, helping them understand what firefighters look like and wear when responding to a fire.

In another session, Firefighters Zack Morrow, Angel Jimenez and Shawn Ocombe instructed students on how to safely escape a burning building. Their lesson focused on life-saving techniques that students can use to protect themselves in the event of a fire.

Rounding out the program, Firefighter Devin Jenkins guided students through the equipment carried on a fire truck, explaining how each tool is used during fire suppression efforts.
