Decatur Man Indicted in July Homicide Following Multi-Agency Investigation

A months-long investigation into a July shooting in Meigs County has led to the indictment of a Decatur man in connection with the death of 45-year-old Jason Paul Burnette.

On July 6, at the request of the 9th Judicial District Attorney General's Office, the Tennessee Bureau of Investigation joined Meigs County Sheriff's Office detectives to investigate a fatal shooting at a residence in the 700 block of Peakland Road in Decatur. Through the course of the investigation, authorities identified Chad Mitchell Lankford, 44, as the individual believed to be responsible for Burnette's death.

On November 24, the Meigs County Grand Jury returned an indictment charging Lankford with one count of First Degree Murder. He was arrested shortly afterward and booked into the Meigs County Jail on a \$1 million bond.

Officials emphasize that the charge is an allegation, not evidence of guilt. Lankford is presumed innocent unless and until proven guilty in a court of law.

Woods Fire Burns Three Acres on County Road 651



A woods fire on County Road 651 near Athens burned roughly three acres Monday evening after spreading from one property to a neighboring area, according to fire officials. The property owner told responders they did not know how the blaze began.

The fire was reported around 6:30 p.m. and drew multiple agencies to the scene, including Riceville Fire, Claxton Fire, Etowah Rural Fire, and Calhoun Fire. Riceville Assistant Fire Chief David Wright served as incident commander.

Crews worked to contain the fire and prevent further spread. No injuries were reported.

A head-on collision Tuesday afternoon in the 2600 block of Highway 11 near Browder's Pond left a woman and a child injured, according to authori-


Officials say a 32-year-old woman driving a 2006 Pontiac Vibe was traveling south with a 4-year-old passenger when a 38-year-old man driving a 2001 Dodge van, headed north, collided with her vehicle. The impact

occurred around mid-afternoon.

The woman and the child were transported by ambulance to Athens Hospital for treatment. The driver of the van was evaluated at the scene by EMS but declined further medical care.

Responding agencies included Niota Fire, North McMinn Fire, Athens Rural Fire, AMR, and the McMinn County Sheriff's Department. Tennessee Highway Patrol Trooper Preston Meadows is leading the investigation.

\$100,000 Grant Awarded to Support Renovations at Etowah's Historic Gem Theater

Etowah's historic Gem Theater is set to receive significant updates following the announcement of a \$100,000 grant awarded to the city through the Tourism Enhancement Grant program administered by the Tennessee Department of Tourism Development (TDTD).

State Representative Mark Cochran and State Senator J. Adam Lowe shared the news this week, noting that the funding will help advance ongoing efforts to preserve and modernize one of Etowah's most recognizable landmarks. The grant supports projects such as stage improvements, updated signage, historic preservation work, ADA accessibility upgrades, and enhancements to local attractions.

The Gem Theater, built in 1906 and converted into a show house in 1918, has long served as a cultural centerpiece for the community and a regional draw for family-friendly entertainment. Today, it remains active as the home of the Gem Players, who continue to bring theater productions and concerts to the area.

City officials say the investment will help protect the theater's historic value while boosting tourism and strengthening the local economy. Renovation plans and timelines are expected to be announced as the project moves forward.
