

# Cochran announces \$150K for McMinn Expo and Show Barn Upgrades

(with attribution)

Assistant House Majority Leader Mark Cochran has announced that the Tennessee Department of Agriculture has awarded \$150,000 to improve the McMinn County Layman Agricultural Exposition Center and Show Barn.

McMinn County will provide matching funds, bringing the total project cost to about \$300,000.

Planned improvements at the Expo Center include new portable bleachers, upgraded water and arena surfaces, a wash rack structure, a public announcement system, and an interior sprinkler system.

The Show Barn renovations will add guttering, fascia boards, LED lighting, electrical and plumbing upgrades, new pens, storage, fencing, steel bathroom doors, additional parking, and a concession stand converted from former showers.

The funding is part of the Department of Agriculture's ongoing efforts to support Tennessee's agriculture and forestry industry.



### **Athens Veteran Honors Heroes With Painted Fence Tribute**



A colorful fence in Athens has become a powerful tribute to veterans and first responders, thanks to Navy veteran Susan Ratliff.

Each post along the fence tells a story: a Battlefield Cross, a Black Hawk helicopter, and the number 22 — symbolizing the daily veteran suicide rate.

Neighbor Donna Henderson said, "I have lost several family members in the military, several friends to suicide after the military, and it just touches my heart that she would take her time and effort to do something like this."


Ratliff, who served in Operation Desert Storm and retired in 1999, said the fence also provides comfort. "On really tough nights, I can come out and walk my fence, and it helps," she said.

Visitors often stop to walk the fence and take photos, including Sgt. Jerry Wattenbarger, a first responder who once helped Ratliff during a crisis. Battling PTSD and depression, Ratliff shares this advice for others: "You just wait five minutes, if you can wait five minutes, and if you still feel it, wait five more minutes."

Her dedication was recognized with a \$500 award from NewsChannel 9 and the McMahan Law Firm.

When thanked for her service, Ratliff simply replied, "It was my honor." Source: News Channel9


