## Grants for McMinn, Meigs & Polk Counties

Tennessee Gov. Bill Lee and Department of Economic and Community Development Commissioner Stuart C. McWhorter announced that 34 communities statewide will receive funding from the latest round of ThreeStar grants. In total, TNECD is awarding \$9.6 million in funding to Tennessee communities to support local workforce training, health and economic development initiatives. The ThreeStar Program is a strategic community development program developed to assist communities in preparing for a better future. Updated in 2025, the program now incorporates asset-based planning and a two-year timeline to accomplish longand short-term goals. The program helps communities develop goals to maximize their local assets and drive economic development. In our area the McMinn County Economic Development Agency will receive \$20,000, Meigs County will receive \$238,000 and Polk County will receive \$249,860.

### Gas Prices Hold Steady as McMinn Drivers See Relief at the Pump

Stability is the name of the game to start October, with the national average for a gallon of regular gas holding steady at \$3.15. But here in McMinn County, drivers are paying well below that number — averaging \$2.72 a gallon this week.

The drop comes as demand for gasoline has eased nationwide, falling from 8.95 million barrels per day to 8.51 million, according to the U.S. Energy Information Administration. Meanwhile, overall supply climbed to 220.7 million barrels, helping push prices down. Seasonal trends are also at play, as stations transition to cheaper winter-blend fuel and crude oil production remains steady despite scheduled refinery maintenance.

Tennessee continues to rank among the cheapest places in the country to fill up, with an average price of \$2.78 statewide. That places the Volunteer State in the top five for lowest gas costs nationwide, alongside Oklahoma, Mississippi, Louisiana, and Texas.

Electric vehicle drivers, however, aren't seeing the same kind of break. Tennessee remains one of the 10 most expensive states for public charging, averaging 43 cents per kilowatt hour.

For now, McMinn County motorists are getting some welcome relief at the pump — just in time for the cooler months ahead.
