#### Athens Planning Commission to Review New Subdivisions and Annexation Plan



The Athens Municipal-Regional Planning Commission will meet at noon on Monday, October 6, in the conference room at City Hall to consider several subdivision plats and an annexation plan for properties within the city's growing residential areas.

Among the items on the agenda are final plat approvals for two developments and preliminary approval for a larger proposed subdivision off Lee Drive.

Mesana Investments LLC is seeking final plat approval for an 8.43-acre property off Shadows Lawn Drive that would include 40 residential lots. Chester Leroy and Regina Brown are also requesting final plat approval for property located at the corner of West College Street and Thompson Street, combining six existing lots into a single 0.8-acre parcel.

In new business, Riverstone Construction has submitted a preliminary plat for a proposed 65-lot subdivision on a 22.2-acre tract located off Lee Drive. Commissioners will also hold a public hearing and consider a recommendation for the plan of services related to the annexation of a remaining 2.35-acre portion of the same property.

The meeting will include opportunities for public comments, petitions, and requests from the audience.
