Driver Injured After Camaro Crashes Into Creek on I-75 Sunday Evening



A 52-year-old man was seriously injured Sunday evening after his 2015 Chevrolet Camaro lost control on Interstate 75 in McMinn County. The crash occurred around 6:45 p.m. near the 56-mile marker, when the southbound vehicle veered into the median, struck two trees, and came to rest upside down in a creek.

Emergency crews from the Niota Rural Fire Department, Athens Rural Fire Department, North McMinn Fire Department, and AMR responded to the scene, along with deputies from the McMinn County Sheriff's Office. The driver, who was the only occupant of the

vehicle, was freed from the wreckage and transported by AMR ambulance to the University of Tennessee Medical Center in Knoxville for treatment.

THP Trooper Chandler Lamar is leading the investigation into the crash. Chad Gates with Niota Fire Department was in charge of the scene.

Driver Unhurt After Early-Morning Deer Collision on Hwy 307



An early-morning collision with a deer left a 2023 Ford F-150 damaged but its driver unharmed Sunday around 1 a.m. on Highway 307 near Athens.

According to officials, the truck struck the deer as it crossed the roadway. Responding to the scene were Niota Rural Fire, Englewood Rural Fire, and Athens Rural Fire departments. McMinn County Sheriff's Deputy Darrell Wright investigated the accident, while Niota Rural Fire Training Officer Chad Gates was in command of the scene.

Authorities remind drivers that this time of year brings a spike in deer-related crashes. While many go unreported, Tennessee averages about 7,700 deer collisions annually, and most are unavoidable despite cautious driving.

October 29: Importance of Nutrition presented by Jackie Berry, MS, RD, LDN, Director of Community Wellness at Starr Regional Medical Center



"A Retrospective" at the Arts Center during October



Athens Area Council for the Arts (AACA) is pleased to present **A Retrospective**, an exhibit of work by Chattanooga-based artist, Doug McCoy. The work is available for viewing **October 6 - November 7**, **2025**. The exhibit will be on display on the Gallery Wall in the Peggy Dow Performance Center at The Arts Center. Viewing hours are Monday, Tuesday, Thursday, and Friday, 10:00 AM to 5:00 PM, and during special events. Meet the artist at the opening reception on Friday October 24 at 5:00 PM in the same location.

"I could draw before I could speak," says artist Doug McCoy. "After decades of creating and exhibiting I have crafted many artist statements. I've written about my materials, my inspirations, and what I hope to

convey through my art, but what it boils down to is four words. I create. You enjoy."

A Retrospective features a sampling of popular series that artist Doug McCoy created over the last two decades. These acrylic and ink paintings are sometimes whimsical, sometimes worrisome. While a few of the pieces are older, the majority were recently created specifically for this exhibit. Expect to see a mix of McCoy's rich imagination and unique perspective. From Doug's colorful pop referential figuring to his inextricable detail work with pen, watercolor and acrylic, A Retrospective walks you through the process of this evolving artist.

Doug McCoy is a native of Chattanooga, TN who has been involved in various fields of art, theater and music in his hometown for several decades. A long-time resident of nearby Ooltewah, TN, Doug now focuses exclusively on painting and drawing. He received his BA at UTC after studies in the areas of art, theater and literature. Doug brings his diverse knowledge of different arts to every painting; rhythm in line, harmony in color, and drama in shape and subject. Doug has regularly exhibited his works in numerous juried shows and exhibitions. Among his awards is a piece on permanent display in Chattanooga's sister city in Germany. All AACA programs are supported by the City of Athens and sponsors recognized on AACA's website.
