Honorees recognized at Annual United Way Award Ceremony



ACT Announces Auditions for 'Steel Magnolias'



Athens Community Theatre will hold one night of auditions for *Steel Magnolias* on Tuesday, Feb. 24, at 6 p.m. at The Arts Center. The production, directed by G. David Brown, is part of ACT's Mainstage Series and will run April 17-26 in the Sue E. Trotter Black Box Theater.

The director is seeking six women, ages 18 and older, with roles ranging from characters in their 20s to 60s and beyond. Those auditioning should be prepared to read from the script and take simple direction. Callbacks will be held Wednesday, Feb. 25. Anyone unable to attend Tuesday's audition should contact the director or The Arts Center about attending callbacks.

All who are interested in performing or helping with the production are encouraged to attend auditions and should bring their work, school and family schedules covering Feb. 25 through April 26.

Set in Truvy's beauty salon in Chinquapin, Louisiana, *Steel Magnolias* centers on a close-knit group of women whose humor, friendship and resilience carry them through life's joys and heartbreaks. ACT tickets typically range from \$15 to \$25, and patrons are encouraged to purchase early as performances often sell out.



March Programs in McMinn County Focus on Health, Caregiving and Community Connection

A variety of free educational and wellness programs will be offered in March and early April through UT Extension- McMinn, giving residents opportunities to improve physical health, strengthen brain function and support family caregivers.

The **Arthritis Foundation Exercise Program** will meet March 2–25 on Mondays and Wednesdays from 10 to 11 a.m. at First Baptist Church, 305 Ingleside Ave., Athens. Designed specifically for individuals with arthritis, the class accommodates pain and limited mobility while teaching joint protection and proper body mechanics. Arthritis affects an estimated 70 million Americans, including 1 in 3 adults in Tennessee. Immediately afterward, **WITS Workout** will be held from 11 to 11:30 a.m. at the same location. This interactive brain health program features activities aimed at strengthening memory, focus and recall. Registration for both programs is required by calling 423-745-2852.

Grandparents can attend the **Grandparent Club** on March 4 from 1 to 2 p.m. at the McMinn County Higher Education Center, 2345 Denso Drive. The free session will include refreshments and a presentation on personal health, along with activities designed to promote connection and wellness.

Family & Community Education Clubs continue meeting monthly across the county. In March, Extension Agent Sarah Kite will present “Care for the Caregiver,” focusing on stress management and practical self-care strategies. The clubs, formerly known as Home Demonstration Clubs and Extension Homemakers, have served Tennessee communities for more than 75 years through research-based education.

Youth Mental Health First Aid certification training will be offered April 1 from 9 a.m. to 3 p.m. at the McMinn County Higher Education Center. The class, limited to 20 grandparents, teaches participants how to recognize and respond to teens facing mental health or substance use challenges. Valued at \$170, the course is free thanks to funding from the Woods Memorial Grant. Lunch and materials are provided. Registration is available at mcminn.tennessee.edu. For more information, contact UT Extension-McMinn at 423-745-2852.



On This Day in History

1839 - U.S. Congress made dueling in Washington, D.C., a felony punishable by up to 10 years of hard labor. The tipping point for the bill had come in 1838: Kentucky Rep. William Graves and Maine Rep. Jonathan Cilley had dueled, which had led to Cilley's death by Grave's hand.

1872 - The Metropolitan Museum of Art in New York City opened to the public.

1902 - Ansel Adams, one of the foremost landscape photographers of the 20th century, was born in San Francisco.

1929 - U.S. Congress formally accepted the deeds of cession of eastern Samoa, forming American Samoa.

1962 - John H. Glenn, Jr. became the first American to orbit Earth, doing so three times. He was the oldest of seven astronauts selected by NASA for Project Mercury spaceflight training and later served as a U.S. senator.

1986 - The Soviet Union launched the core module of the space station Mir, which remained active as a space laboratory for more than 14 years.
