Athens City Council Postpones Historic Overlay Ordinance After Packed Meeting



The Athens City Council met Tuesday night to a packed chamber, with overflow seating required as many attendees—some wearing green shirts—came to oppose a proposed historic overlay ordinance. The meeting opened with routine business, including the call to order, invocation, pledge, roll call, and approval of minutes, all passing quickly. Athens City Intermediate School students also presented a program highlighting school activities, including a “School Olympics” held alongside the 2026 Winter Games in Italy.


During citizen comments on agenda items, five residents spoke against the proposed historic overlay district, citing concerns about its potential impact. The consent agenda, which included surplus property approvals, a Parks & Recreation office relocation, a Fair Housing Month resolution, and several board reappointments, passed unanimously without discussion. Council also unanimously approved rezoning property at Hicks Street and Eastanallee Avenue from industrial to residential.

New business drew the most discussion. Ordinance 1152, which would adjust refuse collection and service charges, sparked debate over requiring roughly 200 residents currently receiving free trash service to begin paying. After discussion of financial impacts and eligibility concerns, the item was postponed for further information. Ordinance 1153, establishing the H-2 Historic Overlay District, drew extensive public opposition and council debate, including one member withdrawing prior support after hearing public comments; it ultimately failed on a 3–2 vote and was postponed indefinitely.

Other items, including a zoning amendment adding requirements for drive-thru oil change facilities and a budget amendment, were approved unanimously. Department reports showed no major issues, while city officials noted rising sales tax revenue and a recent rebound in hotel/motel tax collections, and the city attorney provided updates on ongoing legal matters with no major changes.

During final citizen comments, residents raised concerns including flag lighting across the city and a proposed splash pad at Cook Park, and one speaker became disruptive and was cut off. The meeting adjourned following final comments.

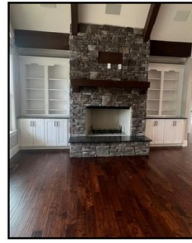

Crash on I-75 Sends Two to Hospital, Charges Possible



A crash on Interstate 75 Southbound at mile marker 54 Wednesday afternoon resulted in injuries to two people and may lead to charges, according to authorities.

The Tennessee Highway Patrol reported that just before 4 p.m., a Ram 350 lost control, left the roadway, and then re-entered the interstate before colliding with a Jeep Compass. The Jeep was driven by a 67-year-old man who sustained injuries and was transported to a local hospital by AMR. His grandson, who was also in the vehicle, suffered minor injuries.



The driver of the Ram was not injured. Authorities say charges could be pending as the investigation continues.

Responding agencies included Niota Rural Fire, North McMinn Rural Fire, the McMinn County Sheriff's Office, and AMR. The crash is being investigated by THP Trooper Dean Conk Jr.

TOSHA Plans Fine After Chemical Exposure at Cleveland Mars Plant

The Tennessee Occupational Safety and Health Administration (TOSHA) says it plans to issue a fine following a chemical exposure incident at the M&M Mars chocolate plant in Cleveland.



According to TOSHA, seven workers were exposed to harsh chemicals at the facility in December, and six of them required medical treatment at a nearby hospital.

Following an inspection, the agency assessed penalties totaling more than \$11,000. TOSHA noted the amount could change if the company contests the citation.

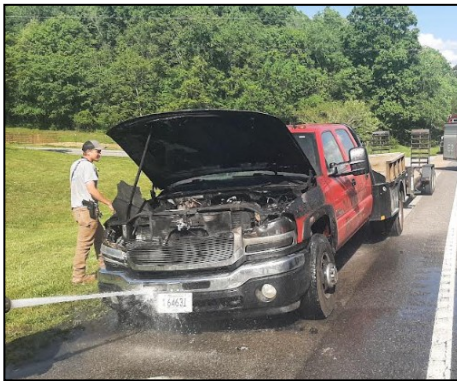

Starr Regional Reports \$55M in 2025 Community Health Services

Starr Regional Medical Center has released its 2025 community benefit report, outlining major investments in healthcare services, staffing, and regional support across McMinn County.

Hospital officials say the report highlights more than \$55.2 million in uncompensated and charitable health services, along with over \$9.6 million in capital improvements, including ICU expansion, outpatient rehabilitation upgrades, a geriatric behavioral health unit expansion, and implementation of tele-ICU services.

In 2025, Starr Regional also expanded specialty care by adding providers in cardiology, OB/GYN, emergency and family medicine, and several telehealth specialties. The hospital reports employing about 675 staff members, distributing more than \$51 million in wages and benefits, and providing additional support for professional development and tuition assistance.

The facility also contributed more than \$27 million in local and state taxes and continued community support for organizations including the American Cancer Society, United Way of McMinn & Meigs Counties, area chambers of commerce, and local schools.
