Athens City Council Meeting Ends Early After Dispute

The Athens City Council's regular meeting Tuesday ended in controversy after a disagreement over an unscheduled personnel-related discussion led to the loss of a quorum and forced the meeting into recess.

Most of the council's scheduled business proceeded routinely. Members recognized Tennessee Wesleyan University's 3RD NAIA National Championship baseball team, honored community volunteer Johnny Coffman with a VIVID Award, approved several purchases and contracts through the consent agenda, authorized additional funding for the McMinn Senior Activity Center, and approved an amendment to the city's ARP stormwater project contract.

The tone of the meeting changed, however, after the conclusion of new business.

Mayor Eaton introduced two additional topics that were not listed on the published agenda. The first involved a request that the city attorney investigate several issues. The second centered on a message from a contracted employee assigned through a temporary agency who had resigned and allegedly raised concerns regarding workplace issues.

Mayor Eaton stated that he and Councilmember Duggan had been improperly accused of creating a hostile work environment and sought to discuss the matter publicly. He attempted to read from the communication sent to council members, describing the message as defamatory.

Interim City Manager Bridget Roberts objected, arguing the matter was administrative in nature and not a council issue. Roberts said the communication had been shared with council as information rather than for council action.

City Attorney Matt Dunn also advised against continuing the discussion, stating the matter involved pending human resources issues.

Several council members then pushed back against the mayor's attempt to address the issue publicly. Vice Mayor Jordan Curtis said the discussion was being handled in an inappropriate setting and should take place through a different process. Councilmember McCowan agreed, stating the council was not responsible for managing day-to-day operations and that continuing the discussion would be improper. Councilmember Duggan also advised the mayor not to proceed.

Despite those objections, Mayor Eaton indicated he intended to continue discussing the matter.

Curtis and McCowan then moved to adjourn and, after further disagreement, announced they would take no further part in the proceedings. Both members left the meeting chambers.

Following their departure, Mayor Eaton again attempted to continue discussing the issue. Roberts again urged him to stop, citing what she described as common decency and the nature of the personnel matter.

With only two council members remaining since Councilmember Sherlin was absent for medical reasons, the council no longer had a quorum to conduct business. The meeting was subsequently recessed.

The council is scheduled to reconvene at 5:45 p.m. Oct. 20 before its next regular meeting.

Madisonville Police Officer Shoots Armed Individual at DHS Office



A Madisonville Police officer shot an armed individual Tuesday afternoon after responding to a report of a former employee carrying a firearm inside the Department of Human Services on Anderson Street.

According to police, officers arrived within a minute of the 4:53 p.m. dispatch call and encountered the individual, who

was armed with two pistols and refused commands. During the encounter, an officer fired their service weapon, striking the individual.

Officers immediately rendered aid until Monroe County EMS arrived. The individual was later flown by UT Lifestar to the University of Tennessee Medical Center. The person's condition has not been released.

The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation has been requested to investigate the officer-involved shooting. The officer has been placed on paid administrative leave in accordance with department policy. Authorities said no further information will be released while the investigation remains active. *Source:* [Madisonville PD](#)
